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15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.22 of Title 70, unless there
18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
20 Hospital Residency Training Program Act".

21 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.23 of Title 70, unless there
23 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

24 As used in the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Act:

1 1. "Eligible hospital" means a hospital which qualifies for new
2 residency training programs under the rules established by the
3 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services or other federal entities
4 authorized to establish residency training programs; and

5 2. "Residency training program" means post-medical-school
6 graduate training programs approved by the Centers for Medicare and
7 Medicaid Services and accredited by the appropriate governing bodies
8 of either the osteopathic or allopathic professions in the training
9 disciplines of family medicine, emergency medicine, general internal
10 medicine, general pediatrics, and obstetrics/gynecology.

11 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.24 of Title 70, unless there
13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
15 Training Program to be administered by the Physician Manpower
16 Training Commission.

17 B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
18 Program shall be to establish new residency training programs
19 affiliated with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
20 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in
21 eligible hospitals, subject to the availability of funding.

22 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.25 of Title 70, unless there
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, in
2 consultation with the Oklahoma State University College of
3 Osteopathic Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of
4 Medicine, designate hospitals for the creation of new residency
5 training programs.

6 B. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, by
7 contract, provide funding to eligible hospitals for the
8 establishment of new residency training programs.

9 C. The Physician Manpower Training Commission is authorized to
10 contract with eligible hospitals to provide funding for the
11 establishment of new residency training programs affiliated with the
12 Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine and the
13 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine.

14 D. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall, with the
15 assistance of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
16 Medicine and the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, provide
17 technical assistance to ensure that residency training programs
18 established pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
19 Program Act become funded by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
20 Services.

21 E. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish
22 reporting mechanisms for eligible hospitals for the monitoring of
23 progress of the new residency training programs.

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1 F. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall present a
2 report on the operation of the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
3 Program to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
4 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives within one (1) month
5 of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature which
6 shall include, but shall not be limited to, information on the
7 progress made in implementing the Oklahoma Hospital Residency
8 Training Program Act.

9 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.26 of Title 70, unless there
11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall establish a
13 residency training advisory board to assist in the designation of
14 eligible hospitals, to prioritize the funding needs of eligible
15 hospitals pursuant to the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training
16 Program Act, and to ensure that rural and underserved areas in the
17 state are given priority.

18 B. The residency training advisory board shall consist of the
19 Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
20 Medicine, the Dean of the University of Oklahoma College of
21 Medicine, the Director of the Oklahoma State University Center for
22 Rural Health, a representative from a statewide association of
23 community-based health care providers, and a representative from a
24 statewide association of hospitals.

1 C. The residency training advisory board shall act as a
2 recommending body to the Physician Manpower Training Commission.

3 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 697.27 of Title 70, unless there
5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund
7 for the Physician Manpower Training Commission to be designated the
8 "Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program Revolving Fund". The
9 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year
10 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the
11 Physician Manpower Training Commission from state funds, federal
12 funds, grants, contracts, and private gifts or bequests dedicated to
13 or for the Oklahoma Hospital Residency Training Program. All monies
14 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may
15 be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training
16 Commission for the purpose of administering the Oklahoma Hospital
17 Residency Training Program. Expenditures from the fund shall be
18 made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims
19 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of State
20 Finance for approval and payment.

21 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2012.

22 SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
23 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
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1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
