16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1272, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1272.
20	UNLAWFUL CARRY
21	A. It shall be unlawful for:
22	1. For any person to carry upon or about his or her person, or
23	in a purse or other container belonging to the person, any pistol,
24	revolver, shotgun or rifle whether loaded or unloaded or any dagger,

- 1 bowie knife, dirk knife, switchblade knife, spring-type knife, sword
- 2 | cane, knife having a blade which opens automatically by hand
- 3 pressure applied to a button, spring, or other device in the handle
- 4 of the knife, blackjack, loaded cane, billy, hand chain, metal
- 5 knuckles, or any other offensive weapon, whether such weapon be
- 6 concealed or unconcealed, except; or
- 7 2. For any person with a valid concealed handgun license issued
- 8 pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act to
- 9 intentionally display the handgun in an angry or threatening manner
- 10 and not in necessary self-defense; provided, however, a concealed
- 11 | handgun licensee shall not be in violation of this subsection if the
- 12 licensee, when carrying the handgun in a concealed manner, briefly
- 13 and openly displays the handgun to the ordinary sight of another
- 14 person.
- B. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit:
- 16 1. The proper use of guns and knives for hunting, fishing,
- 17 | educational or recreational purposes;
- 18 2. The carrying or use of weapons in a manner otherwise
- 19 permitted by statute or authorized by the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act;
- 20 3. The carrying, possession and use of any weapon by a peace
- 21 officer or other person authorized by law to carry a weapon in the
- 22 performance of official duties and in compliance with the rules of
- 23 | the employing agency;

- 4. The carrying or use of weapons in a courthouse by a district judge, associate district judge or special district judge within
  this state, who is in possession of a valid concealed handgun
  license issued pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma SelfDefense Act and whose name appears on a list maintained by the
  Administrative Director of the Courts; or
  - 5. The carrying and use of firearms and other weapons provided in this subsection when used for the purpose of living history reenactment. For purposes of this paragraph, "living history reenactment" means depiction of historical characters, scenes, historical life or events for entertainment, education, or historical documentation through the wearing or use of period, historical, antique or vintage clothing, accessories, firearms, weapons, and other implements of the historical period.
  - B. C. Any person convicted of violating the foregoing provision shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable as provided in Section 1276 of this title.

- 1. "Concealed handgun" means a loaded or unloaded pistol which

  is carried hidden from the detection and view of another person

  either upon or about the person, in a purse or other container

  belonging to the person, or in a vehicle which is operated by the

  person or in which the person is riding as a passenger the presence

  of which is not openly discernible to the ordinary observation of a

  reasonable person; and
  - 2. "Pistol" means any derringer, revolver or semiautomatic firearm which:
    - a. has an overall length of less than sixteen (16) inches and is able to be  $\frac{\text{fully}}{\text{concealed from detection}}$  and view,
    - b. is capable of discharging a projectile composed of any material which may reasonably be expected to be able to cause lethal injury,
    - c. is designed to be held and fired by the use of a single hand, and
    - d. uses either gunpowder, gas or any means of rocket propulsion to discharge the projectile.

The definition of pistol for purposes of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act shall not apply to homemade or imitation pistols, flare guns, underwater fishing guns or blank pistols.

- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1321.12 of Title 21, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. No person acting on behalf or under the authority of the state or a political subdivision of the state may do any of the following during the existence of a proclaimed state of emergency:
- 1. Prohibit or restrict the otherwise lawful possession, use, carrying, transfer, transportation, storage, or display of a firearm or ammunition;
- 2. Seize or confiscate, or authorize the seizure or confiscation of, any otherwise lawfully possessed firearm or ammunition unless the person acting on behalf of or under the authority of the state is defending himself or herself or another from an assault, arresting a person in actual possession of a firearm or ammunition for a violation of law, or unless the firearm or ammunition is being seized or confiscated as evidence of a crime; or
  - 3. Require registration of any firearm or ammunition.
- B. The prohibitions set forth in paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section as such paragraph relates to a transfer shall not apply to the commercial sale of firearms or ammunition if an authorized authority has ordered an evacuation or general closure of businesses in the affected area.

1	C. Any individual aggrieved by a violation of this section may
2	seek relief in an action at law or in equity for redress against any
3	person who subjects such individual, or causes such individual to be
4	subjected, to an action prohibited by this section.
5	D. In addition to any other remedy at law or in equity, an
6	individual aggrieved by the seizure or confiscation of a firearm or
7	ammunition in violation of this section may bring an action for the
8	return of such firearm or ammunition in the district court of the
9	county in which that individual resides or in which such firearm or
10	ammunition is located.
11	E. In any action or proceeding to enforce the provisions of
12	this section, the court shall award the prevailing plaintiff costs
13	and reasonable attorney fees.
14	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2012.
