SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 17-101, as
 amended by Section 1, Chapter 101, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2013,
 Section 17-101), is amended to read as follows:

Section 17-101. The following words and phrases as used in this
act, unless a different meaning is clearly required by the context,
shall have the following meanings:

7 (1) "Retirement system" shall mean the Teachers' Retirement
8 System of Oklahoma, as defined in Section 17-102 of this title.

9 (2)"Public school" shall mean a school district, a state 10 college or university, the State Board of Education, the State Board 11 of Career and Technology Education and any other state educational 12 entity conducted within the state supported wholly or partly by 13 public funds and operating under the authority and supervision of a 14 legally constituted board or agency having authority and 15 responsibility for any function of public education. "Public 16 school" shall also mean a tuition free, nonprofit alternative school 17 of choice that provides education, therapeutic counseling and 18 outreach programs which is aligned with a school district and which 19 receives grant funds from governmental sources.

(3) "Classified personnel" shall mean any teacher, principal,
superintendent, supervisor, administrator, librarian, certified or
registered nurse, college professor, or college president whose
salary is paid wholly or in part from public funds. An employee of
any state department, board, board of regents or board of trustees,

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1 who is in a supervisory or an administrative position, the function of which is primarily devoted to public education, shall be 2 3 considered classified personnel under the meaning of this act, at the discretion of the Board of Trustees of the Teachers' Retirement 4 5 System. The term "teacher" shall also include instructors and counselors employed by the Department of Corrections and holding 6 7 valid teaching certificates issued by the State Department of Education. Provided, that a person employed by the Department of 8 9 Corrections as an instructor or counselor shall have been actively 10 engaged in the teaching profession for a period of not less than 11 three (3) years prior to employment to be eligible to participate in 12 the Oklahoma Teachers' Retirement System. The Department of 13 Corrections shall contribute the employer's share to the Oklahoma 14 Teachers' Retirement System.

15 "Nonclassified optional personnel" shall include cooks, (4)16 janitors, maintenance personnel not in a supervisory capacity, bus 17 drivers, noncertified or nonregistered nurses, noncertified 18 librarians, and clerical employees of the public schools, state 19 colleges, universities or any state department, board, board of 20 regents or board of trustees, the functions of which are primarily 21 devoted to public education and whose salaries are paid wholly or in 22 part from public funds.

(5) "Employer" shall mean the state and any of its designated agents or agencies with responsibility and authority for public

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1 education, such as boards of education of elementary and independent school districts, boards of regents, boards of control or any other 2 3 agency of and within the state by which a person may be employed for 4 service in public education. "Employer" shall also mean the board 5 of directors of a tuition free, nonprofit alternative school of choice that provides education, therapeutic counseling and outreach 6 7 programs which is aligned with a school district and which receives grant funds from governmental sources. 8

9 (6) "Member" shall mean any teacher or other employee included 10 in the membership of the system as provided in Section 17-103 of 11 this title.

12 (7) "Board of Trustees" shall mean the board provided for in13 Section 17-106 of this title to administer the retirement system.

14 (8) "Service" shall mean service as a classified or 15 nonclassified optional employee in the public school system, or any 16 other service devoted primarily to public education in the state.

17 (9) "Prior service" shall mean service rendered prior to July
18 1, 1943.

(10) "Membership service" shall mean service as a member of the classified or nonclassified personnel as defined in paragraphs (3) and (4) of this section.

(11) "Creditable service" shall mean membership service plus
any prior service authorized under this title.

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(12) "Annuitant" shall mean any person in receipt of a
 retirement allowance as provided in this title.

3 (13) "Accumulated contributions" shall mean the sum of all 4 amounts deducted from the compensation of a member and credited to 5 his individual account in the Teacher Savings Fund, together with 6 interest as of June 30, 1968.

7 (14) "Earnable compensation" shall mean the full rate of the 8 compensation that would be payable to a member if he worked the full 9 normal working time.

10 (15) "Average salary":

11 for those members who joined the System prior to July (a) 12 1, 1992, shall mean the average of the salaries for 13 the three (3) years on which the highest contributions 14 to the Teachers' Retirement System was paid not to 15 exceed the maximum contribution level specified in 16 Section 17-116.2 of this title or the maximum 17 compensation level specified in subsection paragraph 18 (28) of this section. Provided, no member shall 19 retire with an average salary in excess of Twenty-five 20 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) unless the member has 21 made the required election and paid the required 22 contributions on such salary in excess of Twenty-five 23 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), or unless an eligible 24 member fulfills the requirements of Section 17-116.2C

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of this title in order to have pre-cap removal service included in the retirement benefit computation of the member using the regular annual compensation of the member for any pre-cap removal year of service so included subject to the maximum average salary amount, and

(b) for those members who join the System after June 30,
1992, shall mean the average of the salaries for five
(5) consecutive years on which the highest
contribution to the Teachers' Retirement System was
paid. Only salary on which required contributions
have been made may be used in computing average
salary.

(16) "Annuity" shall mean payments for life derived from the "accumulated contributions" of a member. All annuities shall be payable in equal monthly installments.

17 (17) "Pension" shall mean payments for life derived from money 18 provided by the employer. All pensions shall be payable in equal 19 monthly installments.

20 (18) "Monthly retirement allowance" is one-twelfth (1/12) of 21 the annual retirement allowance which shall be payable monthly.

(19) "Retirement Benefit Fund" shall mean the fund from which all retirement benefits shall be paid based on such mortality tables as shall be adopted by the Board of Trustees.

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(20) "Actuary" shall mean a person especially skilled through
 training and experience in financial calculation respecting the
 expectancy and duration of life.

4 (21) "Actuarial equivalent" shall mean a benefit of equal value
5 when computed upon the basis of such mortality and other tables as
6 shall be adopted by the Board of Trustees.

7 (22) The masculine pronoun, whenever used, shall include the 8 feminine.

9 (23) "Actuarially determined cost" shall mean the single sum 10 which is actuarially equivalent in value to a specified pension 11 amount as determined on the basis of mortality and interest 12 assumptions adopted by the Board of Trustees.

13 (24) "Normal retirement age" means the earliest date upon
14 which:

15 (a) a member reaches the age sixty-two (62) with respect 16 to a member whose first creditable service occurs 17 prior to November 1, 2011, unless the member reaches a 18 normal retirement date pursuant to subparagraph (c) or 19 subparagraph (d) of this paragraph, or 20 a member reaches the age of sixty-five (65) with (b) 21 respect to a member whose first creditable service 22 occurs on or after November 1, 2011, or with respect 23 to a member whose first creditable service occurs on 24 or after November 1, 2011, reaches a normal retirement

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1 date pursuant to subparagraph (d) of this paragraph 2 having attained a minimum age of sixty (60) years, or 3 (C) the age at which the sum of a member's age and number 4 of years of creditable service total eighty (80), with 5 respect to a member whose first creditable service occurred prior to July 1, 1992, and who does not reach 6 7 a normal retirement age pursuant to subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, or 8

9 (d) the age at which the sum of a member's age and number 10 of years of creditable service total ninety (90), with 11 respect to a member whose first creditable service 12 occurred on or after July 1, 1992, but prior to 13 November 1, 2011, if the member does not reach a 14 normal retirement age pursuant to subparagraph (a) of 15 this paragraph.

16 (25) "Regular annual compensation" means salary plus fringe 17 benefits, excluding the flexible benefit allowance pursuant to 18 Section 26-105 of this title and for purposes pursuant to Section 19 17-101 et seq. of this title. For purposes of this definition, 20 regular annual compensation shall include:

- (a) salary which accrues on a regular basis in proportion
 to the service performed, including payments for staff
 development,
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1 (b) amounts that would otherwise qualify as salary under 2 paragraph subparagraph (a) of this subsection 3 paragraph but are not received directly by the member 4 pursuant to a good faith, voluntary written salary 5 reduction agreement in order to finance payments to a deferred compensation or tax-sheltered annuity program 6 7 or to finance benefit options under a cafeteria plan qualifying under the United States Internal Revenue 8 9 Code, 26 U.S.C., Section 101 et seq., 10 (C) group health and disability insurance, group term life 11 insurance, annuities and pension plans, provided on a 12 periodic basis to all qualified employees of the 13 employer, which qualify as fringe benefits under the 14 United States Internal Revenue Code, and 15 (d) excluded from regular annual compensation are: 16 expense reimbursement payments, 1. 17 2. office, vehicle, housing or other maintenance 18 allowances, 19 3. the flexible benefit allowance provided pursuant 20 to Section 26-105 of this title, 21 4. payment for unused vacation and sick leave, 22 5. any payment made for reason of termination or 23 retirement not specifically provided for in 24

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1 subparagraphs (a) through (c) of this subsection 2 paragraph, 3 6. maintenance or other nonmonetary compensation, 4 7. payment received as an independent contractor or 5 consultant, pursuant to a lawful contract which 6 complies with the requirements of subsection B of 7 Section 6-101.2 of this title, 8. any benefit payments not made pursuant to a valid 8 9 employment agreement, 10 compensation for clinical related activity 9. performed in the University of Oklahoma Health 11 12 Sciences Center (OUHSC) or Oklahoma State 13 University Center for Health Sciences (OSU-CHS) 14 Professional Practice Plan Plans, and 15 10. any other compensation not described in 16 subparagraphs (a) through (c) of this subsection 17 paragraph. 18 (26) "Teacher" means classified personnel and nonclassified 19 optional personnel. 20 "Active classroom teacher" means a person employed by a (27)21 school district to teach students specifically identified classes 22 for specifically identified subjects during the course of a 23 semester, and who holds a valid certificate or license issued by and 24

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in accordance with the rules and regulations of the State Board of
 Education.

3 (28) "Maximum compensation level" shall, except as otherwise 4 authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 17-116.2C of this 5 title, mean:

- 6 (a) Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for
 7 creditable service authorized and performed prior to
 8 July 1, 1995, for members not electing a higher
 9 maximum compensation level,
- 10 (b) Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) for creditable
 11 service authorized and performed prior to July 1,
 12 1995, for members electing a maximum compensation
 13 level in excess of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars
 14 (\$25,000.00),
- 15 Twenty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (C) 16 (\$27,500.00) for members who, as of June 30, 1995, had 17 elected to have a maximum compensation level not in 18 excess of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), 19 and who were employed by an entity or institution 20 within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education 21 for creditable service authorized and performed on or 22 after July 1, 1995, but not later than June 30, 1996, 23 if such member does not elect a higher maximum

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compensation level for this period as authorized by Section 17-116.2A of this title,

- (d) Thirty-two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$32,500.00) for members employed by a comprehensive university if the member meets the requirements imposed by Section 17-116.2A of this title and the member elects to impose a higher maximum compensation level for service performed on or after July 1, 1995, but not later than June 30, 1996,
- 10 (e) Forty-four Thousand Dollars (\$44,000.00) for members 11 who, as of June 30, 1995, had elected to have a 12 maximum compensation level in excess of Twenty-five 13 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), and who were employed 14 by an entity or institution within The Oklahoma State 15 System of Higher Education for creditable service 16 authorized and performed on or after July 1, 1995, but 17 not later than June 30, 1996, if such member does not 18 elect a higher maximum compensation level for this 19 period as authorized by Section 17-116.2A of this 20 title,
- (f) Forty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$49,000.00) for members employed by a comprehensive university if the member meets the requirements imposed by Section 17-116.2A of this title and the member elects to impose a higher

- 5 (b) Oklahoma State University and all of its constituent agencies, including the Oklahoma State University 6 7 Agricultural Experiment Station, the Oklahoma State University Agricultural Extension Division, the 8 9 Oklahoma State University College of Veterinary 10 Medicine, the Oklahoma State University Center for 11 Health Sciences, the Technical Branch at Oklahoma 12 City, the Oklahoma State University Institute of 13 Technology-Okmulgee and Oklahoma State University-14 Tulsa.

(30) "Retirement contract" means the document prepared by the Teachers' Retirement System upon member request, which incorporates member's selected retirement option, and which must be executed and submitted to the Teachers' Retirement System no less than thirty (30) days prior to the projected retirement date. SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014."
