COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to consumer protection; creating the Oklahoma Fantasy Contests Act; defining terms; requiring fantasy contest operator to register with the Department of Consumer Credit; prescribing operator to implement specified procedures; mandating annual independent audit; specifying standards for audit; directing submission of audit to Department; prescribing penalty for violation of act; authorizing collection through civil action by the Department; construing applicability; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1025 of Title 15, unless there

is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Fantasy Contests Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1026 of Title 15, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Oklahoma Fantasy Contests Act:

- 1. "Confidential information" means information related to the play of a fantasy contest by fantasy contest players obtained as a result of or by virtue of a person's employment;
 - 2. "Department" means the Department of Consumer Credit;
- 3. "Entry fee" means cash or cash equivalent that is required to be paid by a fantasy contest player to a fantasy contest operator to participate in a fantasy contest;
- 4. "Fantasy contest" means any fantasy or simulated game or contest, in which:
 - a. the value of all prizes and awards offered to winning participants are established and made known to the participants in advance of the contest,
 - b. all winning outcomes reflect the relative knowledge and skill of the participants and shall be determined predominantly by accumulated statistical results of the performance of individuals, including athletes in the case of sports events, and

- c. no winning outcome is based on the score, point spread or any performance or performances of any single actual team or combination of such teams or solely on any single performance of an individual athlete or player in any single actual event;
- 5. "Fantasy contest operator" means a person or entity that offers fantasy contests with an entry fee for a cash prize to members of the public; and
- 6. "Fantasy contest player" means a person who participates in a fantasy contest offered by a fantasy contest operator.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1027 of Title 15, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. A fantasy contest operator offering fantasy contests with an entry fee in this state shall register with the Department of Consumer Credit. The registration shall be valid upon receipt and payment of a fee not to exceed Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00).
- B. A fantasy contest operator shall implement procedures for fantasy contests with an entry fee that are intended to:
- 1. Prevent employees of the fantasy contest operator and relatives living in the same household as such employees from competing in any public fantasy contest offered by any fantasy contest operator in which the operator offers a cash prize;

- 2. Prevent sharing of confidential information that could affect the fantasy contest play with third parties until the information is made publicly available;
- 3. Prevent the fantasy contest operator from participating in the fantasy contest he or she offers;
- 4. Verify that a fantasy contest player in the fantasy contest is eighteen (18) years of age or older;
- 5. Ensure that individuals who participate or officiate in a game or contest that is the subject of the fantasy contest will be restricted from entering the fantasy contest that is determined, in whole or in part, on the accumulated statistical results of a team of individuals in the game or contest in which they are a player;
- 6. Allow individuals to restrict themselves from entering the fantasy contest upon request and provide reasonable steps to prevent those individuals from entering such fantasy contests offered by the fantasy contest operator;
- 7. Disclose the number of entries a single fantasy contest player may submit to each fantasy contest and take reasonable steps to prevent players from submitting more than the allowable number; and
- 8. Segregate player funds from operational funds and maintain a reserve in the form of cash, cash equivalents, an irrevocable letter of credit, a bond or a combination thereof in the amount of the deposits in player accounts for the benefit and protection of

authorized fantasy contest players' funds held in fantasy contest accounts.

C. A fantasy contest operator offering fantasy contests with an entry fee in the state shall annually contract a third party to perform an independent audit, consistent with the standards established by the Public Company Accounting Oversight Board, to ensure compliance with all of the requirements in the Oklahoma

Fantasy Contests Act and submit the results of the independent audit to the Department of Consumer Credit.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1028 of Title 15, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person, firm, corporation, association, agent or employee who violates any provision of the Oklahoma Fantasy Contests Act shall be liable for a civil penalty of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each violation, which shall accrue to the state and may be recovered in a civil action brought by the Department of Consumer Credit.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1029 of Title 15, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Nothing contained in Sections 941 through 961 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be applicable to a fantasy contest as defined in the Oklahoma Fantasy Contests Act.
