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17 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the (stricken) title, enacting
18 clause and entire bill and insert

19 "An Act relating to children; creating the Task Force
20 on Trauma-Informed Care; providing for membership;
21 providing for appointment of chair and vice-chair;
22 authorizing staff assistance; providing for duties;

24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 611 of Title 10, unless there is
3 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. There is hereby created until January 1, 2022, the Task
5 Force on Trauma-Informed Care.

6 B. The task force shall consist of twenty-six (26) members as
7 follows:

8 1. One member who is an employee of the State Department of
9 Health appointed by the Commissioner of Health;

10 2. One member who is an employee of the Department of Mental
11 Health and Substance Abuse Services appointed by the Commissioner of
12 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services;

13 3. One member who is an employee of the Department of Human
14 Services appointed by the Director of the Department of Human
15 Services;

16 4. Two members who are employees of the State Department of
17 Education, one of whom shall represent the Sooner Start Program,
18 appointed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction;

19 5. One member who is an employee of the Office of Juvenile
20 Affairs appointed by the Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs;

21 6. One member who is an employee of the Council on Law
22 Enforcement Education and Training appointed by the Director of the
23 Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training;

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1 7. One member who is an employee of the Oklahoma Commission on
2 Children and Youth appointed by the Director of the Commission on
3 Children and Youth;

4 8. One member who is an employee of the Oklahoma Health Care
5 Authority appointed by the Chief Executive Officer of the Health
6 Care Authority;

7 9. One member who is an employee of the Office of the Attorney
8 General appointed by the Attorney General;

9 10. Six members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the
10 Oklahoma House of Representatives as follows:

11 a. one shall be an employee of the Indian Health Service,

12 b. one shall be an employee of the Center for Integrative
13 Research on Childhood Adversity at Oklahoma State
14 University,

15 c. one shall be a representative of an association of
16 Oklahoma physicians,

17 d. one shall be a representative of an Oklahoma chapter
18 of a professional association of pediatricians, and

19 e. two shall be members of the Oklahoma House of
20 Representatives, one of whom shall be from the
21 minority party;

22 11. Six members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore
23 of the Oklahoma State Senate as follows:

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- a. one shall be an employee of the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center's Department of Pediatrics,
- b. one shall be a representative of a child advocacy organization in Oklahoma,
- c. one shall be an employee of the Institute for Building Early Relationships at Oklahoma State University,
- d. one shall be a representative of a consortium of agencies located in an urban area that provides services to children and families in Oklahoma, and
- e. two shall be members of the Oklahoma State Senate, one of whom shall be from the minority party; and

12. Four members shall be appointed by the Governor as follows:

- a. one shall be an officer or director of an association located in a rural area that identifies and promotes the development of a qualified workforce to support the emotional development of infants, toddlers and families,
- b. one shall be a representative of a private foundation that provides funding for early childhood initiatives,
- c. one shall be a recently retired judge with juvenile docket experience, and
- d. one shall be an individual with a history of adverse childhood experiences who received trauma-informed services.

1 C. 1. Members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing
2 authorities. A vacancy on the task force shall be filled by the
3 original appointing authority.

4 2. Appointments to the task force shall be made by December 31,
5 2019, provided that members appointed to the task force pursuant to
6 Section 1, Chapter 112, O.S.L. 2018, shall continue to serve.

7 3. Members of the task force shall annually select from its
8 membership a chair and vice-chair.

9 D. The task force may use the expertise and services of the
10 staffs of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the Oklahoma
11 State Senate. The task force may, as necessary, seek the advice and
12 services of experts in the field of trauma-informed care but without
13 any reimbursement by the State of Oklahoma for any costs associated
14 with such services.

15 E. The task force shall study and make recommendations on a
16 statewide, coordinated approach to preventing trauma in children,
17 particularly the adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) associated
18 with negative health and well-being outcomes across the life span.
19 The task force shall also identify appropriate interventions and
20 supports for children, youth and their families who have experienced
21 or are at risk of experiencing trauma.

22 F. The task force shall publish its findings and
23 recommendations by January 1, 2022, including recommendations for
24 any resulting legislation.

1 G. Travel reimbursement for members of the task force who are
2 legislators shall be made pursuant to Section 456 of Title 74 of the
3 Oklahoma Statutes, and travel reimbursement for members of the task
4 force who are state or university employees shall be reimbursed by
5 the respective employing entity.

6 SECTION 2. REPEALER Section 1, Chapter 112, O.S.L. 2018,
7 is hereby repealed.

8 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
10 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11 be in full force from and after its passage and approval."

8 Education appointed by the State Superintendent of Public
9 Instruction;
- 10 5. One member who is an employee of the Office of Juvenile
11 Affairs appointed by the Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs;
- 12 6. One member who is an employee of the Council on Law
13 Enforcement Education and Training appointed by the Director of the
14 Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training;
- 15 7. One member who is an employee of the Oklahoma Commission on
16 Children and Youth appointed by the Director of the Commission on
17 Children and Youth;
- 18 8. One member who is an employee of the Oklahoma Health Care
19 Authority appointed by the Chief Executive Officer of the Health
20 Care Authority;
- 21 9. One member who is an employee of the Office of the Attorney
22 General appointed by the Attorney General;
- 23 10. Seven members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the
24 Oklahoma House of Representatives as follows:

- a. one shall be an employee of the Indian Health Service,
- b. one shall be an employee of the Center for Integrative Research on Childhood Adversity at Oklahoma State University,
- c. one shall be a representative of an association of Oklahoma physicians,
- d. one shall be a representative of an Oklahoma chapter of a professional association of pediatricians, and
