11 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Delete the stricken title, enacting clause and
12 entire bill and replace with:

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14 "An Act relating to motor vehicles; creating the
15 Oklahoma Driving Automation System Uniformity Act;
16 providing definitions; providing preemption
17 authority; providing for codification; and providing
18 an effective date.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1700 of Title 47, unless there
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 This act shall be known as the "Oklahoma Driving Automation
24 System Uniformity Act".

1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1701 of Title 47, unless there
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 As used in this act:

5 A. "Driving automation system" means hardware and software that
6 are collectively capable of performing part or the entire dynamic
7 task on a sustained basis. The term driving automation system is
8 used generally to describe any system capable of level 1-5 driving
9 automation, as specified in SAE International Recommended Practice
10 J3016 including, but not limited to, core vehicle functions as
11 listed in this section.

12 B. "Dynamic driving task" means all of the real-time
13 operational and tactical functions required to operate a vehicle in
14 on-road traffic, excluding the strategic functions such as trip
15 scheduling and selection of destinations and waypoints and including
16 without limitation:

17 1. Lateral vehicle motion control via steering;

18 2. Longitudinal vehicle motion control via acceleration and
19 deceleration;

20 3. Monitoring the driving environment via object and event
21 detection, recognition, classification and response preparation;

22 4. Object and event response execution;

23 5. Maneuver planning; and

24 6. Enhancing conspicuity via lighting, signaling and gesturing.

1 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1702 of Title 47, unless there
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. Only the State of Oklahoma may enact a law or take any other
5 action to regulate the operation of motor vehicles equipped with
6 driving automation systems in Oklahoma.

7 B. Pursuant to subsection A of this section, the State of
8 Oklahoma:

9 1. Preempts the authority of a county or municipality to
10 prohibit, restrict or regulate the operation of motor vehicles
11 equipped with driving automation systems on the basis of those
12 vehicles being equipped with driving automation systems; and

13 2. Supersedes any existing law or ordinance of a county or
14 municipality that prohibits, restricts or regulates the testing or
15 operation of motor vehicles equipped with driving automation
16 systems.

17 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective in accordance with
18 the provisions of Section 58 of Article V of the Oklahoma
19 Constitution."

2 vehicles being equipped with driving automation systems; and

3 2. Supersedes any existing law or ordinance of a county or
4 municipality that prohibits, restricts or regulates the testing or
5 operation of motor vehicles equipped with driving automation
6 systems.

7 SECTION 8. This act shall become effective in accordance with
8 the provisions of Section 58 of Article V of the Oklahoma
9 Constitution.
