11	An Act relating to the State Department of Health; requiring that portions of certain appropriated funds
12	be used for certain purposes; stating purpose of certain disbursement; requiring the use of certain
13	data; directing the Department to develop method of disbursement; authorizing promulgation of rules;
14	authorizing requests for early transfers of certain funds for specific purposes; providing for lapse of
15	funds under certain conditions; requiring certain budget procedures; prohibiting certain budget
16	procedures; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. From the funds appropriated to the State Department
21	of Health in Enrolled House Bill No. 2765 of the 1st Session of the
22	57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Seven Hundred Eighty Thousand
23	Dollars (\$780,000.00) shall be used to enhance funding at county
24	health departments.

SECTION 2. From the funds appropriated to the State Department of Health in Enrolled House Bill No. 2765 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Forty-seven Dollars (\$758,247.00) shall be used to increase child immunization rates in Oklahoma.

- SECTION 3. From the funds appropriated to the State Department of Health in Enrolled House Bill No. 2765 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be used for the implementation of the Choosing Childbirth Act by the provisions listed in Section 1-740.15 et seq. of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- SECTION 4. From the funds appropriated to the State Department of Health in Enrolled House Bill No. 2765 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$260,000.00) shall be used for the Childhood Lead Screening Program.
- SECTION 5. From the funds appropriated to the State Department of Health in Enrolled House Bill No. 2765 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Eight Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$830,000.00) shall be used for Infectious Disease Prevention.
- SECTION 6. From the funds appropriated to the State Department of Health in Enrolled House Bill No. 2765 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars

(\$100,000.00) shall be used for the operations of the Oklahoma

Athletic Commission, pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma

State Athletic Commission Act.

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SECTION 7. From the funds appropriated to the State Department of Health in Enrolled House Bill No. 2765 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, One Million Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,900,000.00) shall be disbursed to health centers authorized under Section 330 of the Public Health Services Act, and incorporated in the State of Oklahoma. Any disbursement shall be for the purpose of increasing access to primary health care which may include medical, dental, and or mental health and substance abuse treatment services in or near designated Medically Underserved Areas or Medically Underserved Populations. Any disbursement for increased access to primary health care services shall be supported by data according to proportions of patient volume and access for The method of disbursement shall be developed by the uninsured. State Department of Health. The State Commissioner of Health is authorized to promulgate the method of disbursement into rules.

SECTION 8. The Commissioner of the State Department of Health may request through the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services the early transfer by the Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the General Revenue Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the Department's disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

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SECTION 9. Appropriations made by Enrolled House Bill No. 2765
of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature, not including
appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for
the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 (hereafter FY-20), or may be
budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021 (hereafter FY-21).
Funds budgeted for FY-20 may be encumbered only through June 30,
2020, and must be expended by November 15, 2020. Any funds
remaining after November 15, 2020, and not budgeted for FY-21, shall
lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then-current fiscal
year. Funds budgeted for FY-21 may be encumbered only through June
30, 2021. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2021, shall lapse
to the credit of the proper fund for the then-current fiscal year.
These appropriations shall not be budgeted in both fiscal years
simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-20, and not required to pay
obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-21, after
the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared
and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds
from the FY-20 budget work program and after such revision has been
approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
    SECTION 10.
                This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
    SECTION 11.
                 It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
