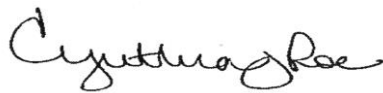

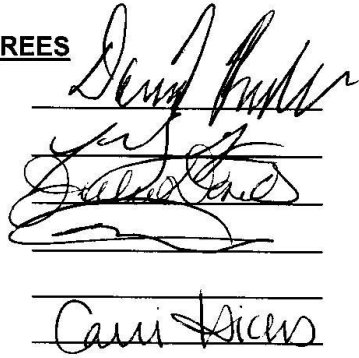

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.8 of Title 63, unless
16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. The Traumatic Brain Injury Task Force (TBI Task Force) is
18 hereby created to identify the needs of and best-practice approaches
19 to traumatic brain injury (TBI) survivors in Oklahoma. The TBI Task
20 Force's role is to make recommendations to the Legislature regarding
21 TBIs. The TBI Task Force shall use a method of dialogue and
22 consensus decision-making to arrive at its recommendations.
23 Recommendations shall be provided no later than January 1, 2022.

24 B. The purpose of the TBI Task Force is to:

1 1. Review and assess care of TBI injuries in the state and
2 determine areas of improvement;

3 2. Analyze care measures being provided in the state;

4 3. Identify and use existing studies of TBI care practices and
5 programs in other states;

6 4. Work with other task forces, committees or organizations
7 that are pursuing initiatives or studies similar to the purpose and
8 duties outlined in this section and develop relationships with other
9 task forces, committees or organizations to collaborate on similar
10 efforts; and

11 5. Collaborate with, serve as a resource to and receive input
12 from health care providers treating persons with TBI.

13 C. The TBI Task Force shall consist of eleven (11) members as
14 follows:

15 1. The Governor shall appoint the executive director;

16 2. The Speaker of the House shall appoint:

17 a. a representative of the Brain Injury Alliance of
18 Oklahoma,

19 b. a social worker with the United States Department of
20 Veterans Affairs,

21 c. a representative of the State Department of
22 Rehabilitation Services,

23 d. the executive director, or his or her designee, of the
24 State Department of Health, and

1 e. a state representative; and

2 3. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

3 a. a state senator,

4 b. a health or allied health specialist,

5 c. a family member of a person with a TBI,

6 d. a special education teacher, and

7 e. a TBI survivor.

8 D. The appointing authorities shall make their initial
9 appointments to the TBI Task Force no later than January 1, 2020.

10 E. Each member of the TBI Task Force shall serve without
11 compensation.

12 F. The executive director shall call the meetings and notify
13 the members of each meeting being called at least seven (7) days in
14 advance.

15 G. Meetings shall be held as often as the executive director
16 deems necessary, but not less than four times per calendar year. A
17 quorum for the transaction of business consists of six members of
18 the TBI Task Force.

19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
