COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE
An Act relating to public finance; requiring signing
of financial statements by certain officers; providing for financial form; requiring submission of
form; providing for penalties; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9010 of Title 62, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
A. All financial statements of any agency, board, commission,
department or program in the executive branch of state government
shall be signed and attested as to the accuracy of the statements by
the chief executive officer.
B. Each agency, board, commission, department or program in the
executive branch of state government shall report its fiscal year
financial information on a form prescribed by the State Auditor and
Inancial information on a form prescribed by the state Auditor and Inspector. The form shall include the following attestation to be

signed by the chief financial officer and chief executive officer:
"Under penalty of perjury, I attest the above-presented financial information is complete and true to the best of my knowledge and all financial records have been accurately reconciled to the financial records of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services." The financial form described in this subsection shall be completed within sixty (60) days of the close of the fiscal year and submitted to the Office of State Auditor and Inspector. The State Auditor and Inspector shall review the form for proper completion and may return the form to the entity until properly completed. Appropriations shall not be considered for the subsequent fiscal year until the form has been approved by the State Auditor and Inspector.

- C. Failure to sign such documents or making any false, fictitious or fraudulent claim for payment of public funds upon or against the State of Oklahoma, or any department or agency thereof, knowing such claim to be false, fictitious or fraudulent, shall subject the chief executive officer to penalties provided by subsection D of this section.
- D. Any person found guilty of violating this section, upon conviction, shall be guilty of a felony punishable by a fine not exceeding Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term not exceeding two (2) years, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

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        E. In addition to the penalties provided in subsection D of
    this section, the penalties provided by Section 24.1 of Title 51 of
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    the Oklahoma Statutes shall also be applicable.
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        F.
            The requirements of this section shall not replace or negate
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    the financial reporting requirements established by Section 34.10 of
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    Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
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        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
