15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 180.5 of Title 60, unless there
17	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	A. On and after the effective date of this act, no for-profit
19	business entity shall transfer any item of tangible personal
20	property to any public trust organized pursuant to the provisions of
21	Section 176 et seq. of Title 60 of the Oklahoma Statutes which, at
22	the time of its transfer, has a fair-cash value or an acquisition
23	cost to the for-profit business entity in excess of One Million

Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

B. On and after the effective date of this act, no for-profit business entity shall enter into a lease transaction with any public trust organized pursuant to the provisions of Section 176 et seq. of Title 60 of the Oklahoma Statutes with respect to any item of tangible personal property which, at the time the lease is executed by the parties, has a fair cash value or an acquisition cost to the for-profit business entity in excess of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). The provisions of this subsection shall be applicable to any transaction which requires the public trust to lease such tangible personal property to a for-profit business entity from which possession of the tangible personal property was originally acquired and shall be applicable to any transaction pursuant to which the tangible personal property is leased or leased back to any other for-profit business entity.

- C. The provisions of this section shall be applicable to tangible personal property as described by this section, the title to which is transferred to any public trust on and after the effective date of this act, but shall not be applicable with respect to such tangible personal property, the title to which was transferred prior to the effective date of this act, or that is subject to other laws or constitutional provisions.
- D. The provisions of this section shall be applicable to tangible personal property as described by this section which becomes subject to a lease transaction pursuant to which any public
