8 An Act relating to definitions and general
9 provisions; designating the mustang as the state
10 horse; providing for noncodification; providing for
11 codification; and providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
14 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

15 The mustang horse, or Choctaw pony, has deeply rich ties to the
16 American Indian tribes of the State of Oklahoma. The mustang horse
17 is a descendant of the horses brought to the Americas in the 1500s
18 by the Spanish conquistadors. The horses brought by the Spanish
19 were pure Spanish mustangs, a relatively small but tough breed of
20 horse. After the introduction of these horses to American Indian
21 tribes, the horses became essential to the tribes, and they began to
22 rely heavily on them for their travels during times of war and while
23 moving their tribal lands, as well as for hunting. In addition, the
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1 mustang horse played a vital role in carrying some Native American
2 people across the Trail of Tears.

3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 98.18 of Title 25, unless there
5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 The mustang horse, or Choctaw pony, a descendant of the first
7 horses brought to the Americas by the Spanish, is hereby designated
8 and adopted as the state horse of the State of Oklahoma.

9 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
