11 An Act relating to motor vehicles; creating the  
12 Oklahoma Driving Automation System Uniformity Act;  
13 providing definitions; providing preemption  
14 authority; providing for codification; and providing  
15 an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1700 of Title 47, unless there  
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 This act shall be known as the "Oklahoma Driving Automation  
21 System Uniformity Act".

22 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1701 of Title 47, unless there  
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 As used in this act:

2 A. "Driving automation system" means hardware and software that  
3 are collectively capable of performing part or the entire dynamic  
4 task on a sustained basis. The term driving automation system is  
5 used generally to describe any system capable of level 1-5 driving  
6 automation, as specified in SAE International Recommended Practice  
7 J3016 including, but not limited to, core vehicle functions as  
8 listed in this section.

9 B. "Dynamic driving task" means all of the real-time  
10 operational and tactical functions required to operate a vehicle in  
11 on-road traffic, excluding the strategic functions such as trip  
12 scheduling and selection of destinations and waypoints and including  
13 without limitation:

14 1. Lateral vehicle motion control via steering;

15 2. Longitudinal vehicle motion control via acceleration and  
16 deceleration;

17 3. Monitoring the driving environment via object and event  
18 detection, recognition, classification and response preparation;

19 4. Object and event response execution;

20 5. Maneuver planning; and

21 6. Enhancing conspicuity via lighting, signaling and gesturing.

22 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1702 of Title 47, unless there  
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1       A. Only the State of Oklahoma may enact a law or take any other  
2 action to regulate the operation of motor vehicles equipped with  
3 driving automation systems in Oklahoma.

4       B. 1. Pursuant to subsection A of this section, the State of  
5 Oklahoma preempts the authority of a county or municipality to  
6 prohibit, restrict or regulate the operation of motor vehicles  
7 equipped with driving automation systems on the basis of those  
8 vehicles being equipped with driving automation systems; and

9       2. Supersedes any existing law or ordinance of a county or  
10 municipality that prohibits, restricts or regulates the testing or  
11 operation of motor vehicles equipped with driving automation  
12 systems.

13       SECTION 4. This act shall become effective in accordance with  
14 the provisions of Section 58 of Article V of the Oklahoma  
15 Constitution.

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
