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7 An Act relating to statutes and reports; amending 75
8 O.S. 2011, Section 13, as amended by Section 1,
9 Chapter 361, O.S.L. 2014 and Section 1, Chapter 293,
10 O.S.L. 2012 (75 O.S. Supp. 2019, Sections 13 and
11 192), which relate to the publication and
12 certification of the Oklahoma Statutes; authorizing
13 the Secretary of State to provide for publication of
14 the Oklahoma Constitution, Oklahoma Statutes and
15 Oklahoma Session Laws in electronic form; authorizing
16 the Secretary of State to select a vendor; providing
17 for items to be included in the electronic
18 publication; exempting selection of vendor from
19 competitive bidding requirements; providing for
20 certification of the Oklahoma Statutes; amending 74
21 O.S. 2011, Section 85.3A, as last amended by Section
22 1, Chapter 472, O.S.L. 2019 (74 O.S. Supp. 2019,
23 Section 85.3A), which relates to The Oklahoma Central
24 Purchasing Act; modifying exemptions to include
selection of vendor for publication of the Oklahoma
Statutes; repealing 75 O.S. 2011, Sections 14, as
amended by Section 2, Chapter 361, O.S.L. 2014, 18,
20 and 191 (75 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 14), which
relate to the Oklahoma Statutes; and providing an
effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 75 O.S. 2011, Section 13, as
amended by Section 1, Chapter 361, O.S.L. 2014 (75 O.S. Supp. 2019,
Section 13), is amended to read as follows:

1 Section 13. A. The Secretary of State is authorized to
2 ~~purchase the required number of statutes and session laws for~~
3 ~~distribution pursuant to the provisions of Section 14 of this title~~
4 provide for the annual compilation, codification and annotation of
5 the Oklahoma Statutes and the Oklahoma Session Laws in the form of
6 electronic publication accessible to the public free of charge.

7 B. The Secretary of State is authorized to select an
8 appropriate vendor for the electronic publication and annual
9 maintenance of compiling, codifying and annotating the Oklahoma
10 Constitution, Oklahoma Statutes and Oklahoma Session Laws; provided,
11 such annotations shall include all versions of a statute or
12 constitutional amendment amended after commencement of the
13 electronic publication. The selection of a vendor by the Secretary
14 of State shall be exempt from the competitive bidding requirement of
15 The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act.

16 C. The Secretary of State is authorized to fulfill any existing
17 contractual obligations and terms currently in place with the state
18 for printed versions of the Oklahoma Statutes and Oklahoma Session
19 Laws.

20 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 293, O.S.L.
21 2012 (75 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 192), is amended to read as
22 follows:

23 Section 192. A. The "Oklahoma Statutes 2011" shall be
24 certified by the Justices of the Oklahoma Supreme Court ~~on November~~

1 ~~7, 2011, are hereby~~ and adopted as the official Statutes of the
2 State of Oklahoma and ~~are declared to~~ after certification be in full
3 force and effect. Provided, however, that this section shall not be
4 construed to repeal or in any way affect or modify any special or
5 local laws or any law making an appropriation or any law relating to
6 any special election or validating act, or any law affecting any
7 bond issue or by which any bond issue may have been authorized, nor
8 to affect any pending proceedings or any existing rights or
9 remedies, nor the running of the statutes of limitations in force at
10 the time of the approval of this section; but all such local and
11 special laws, laws making appropriations, laws relating to special
12 elections, validating acts, and laws relating to or authorizing bond
13 issues, pending proceedings, and existing rights and remedies, and
14 statutes of limitations running and in force at the time of the
15 approval of this section shall continue and exist in all respects as
16 if this section had not been passed. Provided, further, that this
17 section shall not be construed to alter, change, impair, disparage,
18 vest or divest, or in any way affect any right or interest in the
19 United States, the State of Oklahoma, any Indian tribes or Nations
20 of Indians within the State of Oklahoma, nor shall the same be
21 construed to repeal any act of the Legislature of the State of
22 Oklahoma ~~enacted subsequent to the adjournment of the First Regular~~
23 ~~Session of the Fifty-third Legislature of the State of Oklahoma.~~

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1 B. The Secretary of State shall issue a proclamation and
2 publish it in a newspaper of general circulation within the State of
3 Oklahoma stating the date upon which the statutes were published.

4 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 85.3A, as
5 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 472, O.S.L. 2019 (74 O.S. Supp.
6 2019, Section 85.3A), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 85.3A A. Compliance with the provisions of The
8 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act shall not be required of:

- 9 1. County government;
- 10 2. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, the
11 institutions, centers, or other constituent agencies of The Oklahoma
12 State System of Higher Education;
- 13 3. The telecommunications network known as OneNet;
- 14 4. The Department of Public Safety gun range;
- 15 5. The State Treasurer for the following purchases:
 - 16 a. services, including, but not limited to, legal
17 services to assist in the administration of the
18 Uniform Unclaimed Property Act, as provided in Section
19 668 of Title 60 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and
 - 20 b. software, hardware and associated services to assist
21 in the administration of funds and securities held by
22 the state, as provided in Section 71.2 of Title 62 of
23 the Oklahoma Statutes;

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1 6. CompSource Oklahoma if CompSource Oklahoma is operating
2 pursuant to a pilot program authorized by Sections 3316 and 3317 of
3 this title; ~~or~~

4 7. The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs, in accordance
5 with Section ~~2~~ 63.22 of ~~this act~~ Title 72 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
6 or

7 8. The Secretary of State when selecting a vendor for
8 publication of the Oklahoma Statutes in accordance with Section 13
9 of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

10 B. The State Purchasing Director may form an advisory committee
11 consisting of representatives from entities exempted from the
12 provisions of The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. The purpose of
13 the committee shall be to allow committee members to provide input
14 into the development of shared state purchasing contracts,
15 collaboratively participate in the integration of their purchasing
16 platforms or electronic purchasing catalogs, analyze solutions that
17 may be used by state government to meet the purchasing needs of the
18 entities, explore joint purchases of general use items that result
19 in mutual procurement of quality goods and services at the lowest
20 reasonable cost and explore flexibility, administrative relief, and
21 transformation changes through utilization of procurement
22 technology.

23 C. At the invitation of the State Purchasing Director entities
24 exempted from the provisions of The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act

1 shall participate in the advisory committee referenced in subsection
2 B of this section.

3 D. The State Purchasing Director may invite representatives of
4 local government and local common education entities to participate
5 as members of the advisory committee.

6 SECTION 4. REPEALER 75 O.S. 2011, Sections 14, as
7 amended by Section 2, Chapter 361, O.S.L. 2014, 18, 20 and 191 (75
8 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 14), are hereby repealed.

9 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
