12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 334 of Title 61, unless there is
15 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. All new construction of state and municipal buildings open
17 to and frequented by the public commenced after January 1, 2022, and
18 all renovations and replacements of existing public state and
19 municipal buildings open to and frequented by the public commenced
20 after January 1, 2022, shall include at least one baby changing
21 table or universal changing station. This section shall only apply
22 to renovations and replacements if the renovation or replacement
23 exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the value of the state or municipal
24 building. If a baby changing table or universal changing station is

1 not accessible in such a building or facility to both men and women,
2 the building code shall require that the building or facility be
3 equipped with at least one such table accessible to men and at least
4 one such table accessible to women.

5 B. As used in this act, "universal changing station" means an
6 adult changing table placed within an enclosed restroom facility, or
7 other similar private facility, that is for use by babies, older
8 children, the elderly and adults with disabilities or special health
9 care needs containing a height-adjustable adult changing table that
10 is either freestanding or floor- or wall-mounted with a safety rail
11 and can be used by a person of either sex, with his or her care
12 provider, for personal hygiene purposes.

13 C. This act shall only apply to state and municipal buildings
14 with an average daily occupancy of two hundred or more individuals.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
