12 An Act relating to the Child Abuse Prevention Act;  
13 providing for dissemination of information related to  
14 the termination of parental rights; requiring the  
15 State Department of Health to provide birth record  
16 information; requiring the Office of Child Abuse  
17 Prevention to include certain statistics in annual  
18 report; providing for review and assessment;  
19 providing for codification; and providing an  
20 effective date.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

22 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-227.10 of Title 63, unless  
24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Department of Human Services shall grant access to the  
Office of Child Abuse Prevention to the identifying information of

1 individuals who have had their parental rights terminated and the  
2 conditions which led to the making of the finding which resulted in  
3 the termination of the rights of the parent pursuant to the  
4 provisions of Section 1-4-502 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes.

5 B. The State Department of Health shall supply the Office of  
6 Child Abuse Prevention with birth record information for a child  
7 born to an individual whose identifying information has been  
8 provided under subsection A of this section.

9 C. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention shall include these  
10 statistics in the annual report outlined in Section 1-227.2 of Title  
11 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

12 D. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention or other appropriate  
13 division of the State Department of Health shall review the  
14 information provided by the Department of Human Services and the  
15 Division of Vital Records and, when appropriate and if the resources  
16 are available, provide an assessment of the family and offer  
17 services if needed.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
