11	An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011,
12	Section 24-100.3, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 311, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 24-
13	100.3), which relates to the School Safety and Bullying Prevention Act; modifying bullying
14	definition; adding term; and providing an effective date.

17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 24-100.3, as
19	amended by Section 2, Chapter 311, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2018,
20	Section 24-100.3), is amended to read as follows:
21	Section 24-100.3 A. As used in the School Safety and Bullying
22	Prevention Act:
23	1. "Bullying" means any pattern of harassment, intimidation ,
24	threatening behavior, physical acts, verbal or unwanted, threatening

or aggressive behavior committed in person or by electronic communication directed toward a student or group of students that results in or is reasonably perceived as being done with the intent to cause negative educational or physical results for the targeted individual or group and is communicated in such a way as to disrupt or interfere with the school's educational mission or the education of any student involves a real or perceived power imbalance and is repeated or creates the fear it will be repeated. Bullying actions shall include but not be limited to making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally and excluding someone from a group as a means of causing harm;

- 2. "Power imbalance" means the attempt by a perpetrator to use observed or perceived personal or situational characteristics to exert control over a targeted student's behavior or limit a victim's ability to respond or stop the aggression;
- 3. "At school" means on school grounds, in school vehicles, at school-sponsored activities, or at school-sanctioned events;
- 3. 4. "Electronic communication" means the communication of any written, verbal, pictorial information or video content by means of an electronic device, including, but not limited to, a telephone, a mobile or cellular telephone or other wireless telecommunication device, or a computer; and
- 4. 5. "Threatening behavior" means any pattern of behavior or isolated action, whether or not it is directed at another person,

1	that a reasonable person would believe indicates potential for
2	future harm to students, school personnel, or school property.
3	B. Nothing in this act shall be construed to impose a specific
4	liability on any school district.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
