BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 322 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
  - A. There is hereby created the Office of Mobility and Public
    Transit within the Department of Transportation. All current
    Transit Division responsibilities, including oversight and
    management of Federal Transit Administration (FTA) grants and
    resources and the State Management Plan, are moved to the Office of
    Mobility and Public Transit. All Federal Transit Administration
    program implementations not currently managed by the Department of
    Transportation shall be moved to the Office of Mobility and Public
    Transit from other state agencies and programs. The Office of
    Mobility and Public Transit is charged with overseeing a network of
    public transit systems that receive adequate funding to ensure the
    mobility needs of all Oklahomans are met in a safe, affordable,
    reliable, consistent and coordinated fashion.
  - B. The Office of Mobility and Public Transit shall promulgate rules and procedures to:

1	1. Implement innovative pilot programs including, but not
2	limited to, microtransit and autonomous vehicles in the following
3	systems:
4	a. EMBARK,
5	b. Tulsa Transit,
6	c. Little Dixie Transit, and
7	d. other transit systems as determined by the Department
8	of Transportation;
9	2. Implement expansion of the current Veterans' Ride Connect
10	call center at Pelivan Transit to create a "one call/one click"
11	statewide system for all citizens; and
12	3. Develop the Oklahoma Public Transit Policy Plan. The plan
13	will be developed jointly by the Department of Transportation and
14	the Oklahoma Transit Association.
15	a. A copy of the plan shall be submitted to the Governor,
16	the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
17	President Pro Tempore of the Senate by July 1, 2020.
18	b. The plan shall:
19	(1) be all-inclusive of the public transit systems in
20	the state,
21	(2) reflect the results of the 2018 Oklahoma Transit
22	Needs Assessment conducted by the Small Urban and
23	Rural Transit Center,
24	(3) include all stakeholder input,

1	(4)	provide for future collaboration and coordination
2		of an effective network of public transit systems
3		across the state,
4	(5)	provide for future collaboration and coordination
5		among all public transit agencies and systems and
6		all stakeholders with an interest in public
7		transit, and
8	(6)	provide for future collaboration and coordination
9		among all state agencies with an interest in
10		public transit including, but not limited to,
11		the:
12		(a) Oklahoma Department of Commerce,
13		(b) Oklahoma Department of Rehabilitation
14		Services,
15		(c) Oklahoma Department of Human Services,
16		(d) Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and
17		Substance Abuse Services,
18		(e) Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs,
19		(f) Oklahoma Association of Centers for
20		Independent Living,
21		(g) Oklahoma Health Care Authority,
22		(h) Oklahoma Employment Security Commission,
23		(i) Oklahoma State Department of Education,

1	(j) Oklahoma Department of Environmental
2	Quality, and
3	(k) Oklahoma Department of Labor.
4	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
5	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 323 of Title 69, unless there is
6	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
7	A. The Transit Division within the Department of
8	Transportation, including oversight and management of Federal
9	Transit Administration grants and resources and the State Management
10	Plan, is transferred into the Office of Mobility and Public Transit.
11	The Executive Director of the Department of Transportation shall
12	assume all executive-level responsibilities for the Office of
13	Mobility and Public Transit and shall function as and possess the
14	powers of the director for the Office of Mobility and Public
15	Transit. For the purposes of this section, the term "transferring
16	agency" shall mean the Transit Division within the Department of
17	Transportation, including oversight and management of Federal
18	Transit Administration grants and resources and the State Management
19	Plan. Any funds appropriated to, in the possession of or allocated
20	to the transferring agency shall be deemed to be funds of the Office
21	of Mobility and Public Transit.
22	B. Upon request of the Executive Director of the Department of
23	Transportation, the personnel of the transferring agency shall

- deliver to the Office of Mobility and Public Transit all books, papers, records and property.
- C. All functions, powers, duties and obligations previously assigned to the transferring agency are hereby transferred to the Office of Mobility and Public Transit.
- D. All rules, regulations, acts, orders, contracts, determinations and decisions of the transferring agency pertaining to the functions and powers herein transferred and assigned to the Office of Mobility and Public Transit in force at the time of such transfer, assignment, assumption or devolution shall continue in force and effect as rules, regulations, acts, orders, contracts, determinations and decisions of the Office of Mobility and Public Transit until duly modified or abrogated by the appropriate body or until otherwise provided by law.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 324 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Aging Services Division within the Department of Human Services shall transfer responsibilities regarding oversight and management of Federal Transit Administration grants and resources under 49 U.S.C., Section 5310 into the Office of Mobility and Public Transit. The Executive Director of the Department of Transportation shall assume all executive-level responsibilities for management and oversight of the Federal Transit Administration grants and

- resources. For the purposes of this section, the term "transferring agency" shall mean the Aging Services Division within the Department of Human Services. Any federal 49 U.S.C., Section 5310 funds or funds in the possession of or allocated to the transferring agency related to 49 U.S.C., Section 5310 transportation services shall be deemed to be funds of the Office of Mobility and Public Transit.
  - B. Upon request of the Executive Director of the Department of Transportation, the personnel of the transferring agency shall deliver to the Office of Mobility and Public Transit all books, papers, records and property related to Federal Transit Authority grants and resources.
  - C. All functions, powers, duties and obligations related to Federal Transit Authority grants and resources previously assigned to the transferring agency are hereby transferred to the Office of Mobility and Public Transit.
  - D. All rules, regulations, acts, orders, contracts, determinations and decisions of the transferring agency pertaining to the functions and powers herein transferred and assigned to the Office of Mobility and Public Transit in force at the time of such transfer, assignment, assumption or devolution shall continue in force and effect as rules, regulations, acts, orders, contracts, determinations and decisions of the Office of Mobility and Public Transit until duly modified or abrogated by the appropriate body or until otherwise provided by law.

1	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.	
2	SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation	
3	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby	
4	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and	
5	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
