11 1525, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 369, O.S.L.  
12 2017, 1-1526, 1-1526.1 and 1-1527, as amended by  
13 Section 2, Chapter 187, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp.  
14 2018, Sections 1-1522, 1-1523, 1-1525 and 1-1527) and  
15 Section 5, Chapter 369, O.S.L. 2017 (63 O.S. Supp.  
16 2018, Section 1-1529), which relate to the Smoking in  
17 Public Places and Indoor Workplaces Act; providing  
18 for codification; and providing an effective date.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1533 of Title 63, unless there  
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 Sections 1 through 17 of this act shall be known and may be  
24 cited as the "Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1534 of Title 63, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act:

1. "Adult day care" means a nonresidential facility that  
supports the health, nutritional, social and daily living needs of  
adults who require assistance or supervision during the day;

1        2. "Business" means a sole proprietorship, partnership, joint  
2 venture, corporation or other business entity, either for-profit or  
3 not-for-profit, including retail establishments where goods or  
4 services are sold, professional corporations and other entities  
5 where legal, medical, dental, engineering, architectural or other  
6 professional services are delivered, and private clubs;

7        3. "Cigar bar" means an establishment that exclusively occupies  
8 an enclosed indoor space and is primarily engaged in the retail sale  
9 of tobacco products for consumption by customers on the premises;

10       4. "Educational facilities" means any property, building,  
11 permanent structure, facility, auditorium, stadium, arena or  
12 recreational facility owned, leased or under the control of a public  
13 school district or private school located in the state. For  
14 purposes of this act, a public school district shall not include a  
15 technology center school district;

16       5. "Electronic smoking device" means any product containing or  
17 delivering nicotine or any other substance intended for human  
18 consumption that can be used by a person in any manner for the  
19 purpose of inhaling vapor or aerosol from the product. The term  
20 includes any such device, whether manufactured, distributed,  
21 marketed or sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, e-hookah or  
22 vape pen, or under any other product name or descriptor;

23       6. "Employee" means a person who performs services for, whether  
24 full time or part time, an employer in consideration for direct or

1 indirect monetary wages or profit or a person who volunteers his or  
2 her services for any private or public entity or individual whether  
3 for compensation or not;

4 7. "Employer" means a person, business, partnership,  
5 association, corporation, including a municipal corporation, trust,  
6 nonprofit entity or any other entity recognized by law that employs  
7 the services of one or more individual persons;

8 8. "Enclosed area" means all space between a floor and a  
9 ceiling that is bounded on at least two sides by walls, doorways or  
10 windows, whether open or closed. A wall includes any retractable  
11 divider, garage door or other physical barrier, whether temporary or  
12 permanent and whether or not containing openings of any kind;

13 9. "Health care facility" means any entity which provides  
14 health services, including, but not limited to, hospitals,  
15 rehabilitation hospitals or other clinics, including weight control  
16 clinics, nursing homes, long-term care facilities, homes for the  
17 aging or chronically ill, laboratories and offices of surgeons,  
18 chiropractors, physical therapists, physicians, psychiatrists,  
19 dentists and all specialists within these professions. This  
20 definition shall include all waiting rooms, hallways, private rooms,  
21 semiprivate rooms and wards within health care facilities;

22 10. "Hookah" means a water pipe and any associated products and  
23 devices which are used to produce fumes, smoke and/or vapor from the  
24

1 heating or burning of material, including, but not limited to,  
2 tobacco, shisha or other plant matter;

3 11. "Indoor workplace" means any indoor place of employment or  
4 employment-type service for or at the request of another individual  
5 or individuals or any public or private entity, whether part time or  
6 full time and whether for compensation or not. Such services shall  
7 include, without limitation, any service performed by an owner,  
8 employee, independent contractor, agent, partner, proprietor,  
9 manager, officer, director, apprentice, trainee, associate, servant  
10 or volunteer. An indoor workplace includes work areas, employee  
11 lounges, restrooms, conference rooms, classrooms, employee  
12 cafeterias, hallways, any other spaces used or visited by employees  
13 and all space between a floor and ceiling that is bounded on at  
14 least two sides by walls, doorways or windows whether open or  
15 closed. The provisions of this section shall apply to such indoor  
16 workplace at any given time, whether or not work is being performed;

17 12. "Place of employment" means an area under the control of a  
18 public or private employer, including, but not limited to, work  
19 areas, private offices, employee lounges, restrooms, conference  
20 rooms, meeting rooms, classrooms, employee cafeterias, hallways,  
21 construction sites, temporary offices and vehicles. A private  
22 residence is not a place of employment unless it is used as a child  
23 care, adult day care or health care facility;

24

1 13. "Playground" means any park or recreational area designed  
2 in part to be used by children that has play or sports equipment  
3 installed or that has been designated or landscaped for play or  
4 sports activities, or any similar facility located on public or  
5 private school grounds or on state grounds or grounds of any  
6 political subdivision of the state;

7 14. "Private club" means an organization, whether incorporated  
8 or not, which is the owner, lessee or occupant of a building or  
9 portion thereof used exclusively for club purposes at all times,  
10 which is operated solely for a recreational, fraternal, social,  
11 patriotic, political, benevolent or athletic purpose, but not for  
12 pecuniary gain, and which only sells alcoholic beverages incidental  
13 to its operation. The affairs and management of the organization  
14 are conducted by a board of directors, executive committee or  
15 similar body chosen by the members at an annual meeting. The  
16 organization has established bylaws and/or a constitution to govern  
17 its activities. The organization has been granted an exemption from  
18 the payment of federal income tax as a club under 26 U.S.C. Section  
19 501;

20 15. "Public event" means an event which is open to and may be  
21 attended by the general public, including, but not limited to, such  
22 events as concerts, fairs, farmers' markets, festivals, parades,  
23 performances and other exhibitions, regardless of any fee or age  
24 requirement;

1        16. "Public place" means an area to which the public is invited  
2 or in which the public is permitted, including, but not limited to,  
3 banks, bars, educational facilities, health care facilities, hotels  
4 and motels, laundromats, parking structures, public transportation  
5 vehicles and facilities, reception areas, restaurants, retail food  
6 production and marketing establishments, retail service  
7 establishments, retail stores, shopping malls, sports arenas,  
8 theaters and waiting rooms. A private residence is not a public  
9 place unless it is used as a child care, adult day care or health  
10 care facility;

11        17. "Recreational area" means any indoor or outdoor, public or  
12 private area open to the public for recreational purposes, whether  
13 or not any fee for admission is charged, including, but not limited  
14 to, amusement parks, athletic fields, beaches, fairgrounds, gardens,  
15 golf courses, parks, plazas, skate parks, swimming pools, trails and  
16 zoos;

17        18. "Restaurant" means any eating establishment regardless of  
18 seating capacity, including, but not limited to, coffee shops,  
19 cafeterias and sandwich stands, as well as kitchens and catering  
20 facilities in which food is prepared on the premises for serving  
21 elsewhere. The term "restaurant" shall include a bar area within  
22 the restaurant;

23        19. "Service line" means an indoor or outdoor line in which one  
24 or more persons are waiting for or receiving service of any kind,

1 whether or not the service involves the exchange of money,  
2 including, but not limited to, ATM lines, concert lines, food vendor  
3 lines, movie ticket lines and sporting event lines;

4 20. "Shopping mall" means an enclosed or unenclosed public  
5 walkway or hall area that serves to connect retail or professional  
6 establishments;

7 21. "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning or carrying any  
8 lighted or heated cigar, cigarette, pipe, hookah or any other  
9 lighted or heated tobacco or plant product intended for inhalation,  
10 including marijuana, whether natural or synthetic, in any manner or  
11 in any form. Smoking includes the use of an electronic smoking  
12 device which creates an aerosol or vapor, in any manner or in any  
13 form, or the use of any oral smoking device for the purpose of  
14 circumventing the prohibition of smoking in this act;

15 22. "Sports arena" means a place where people assemble to  
16 engage in physical exercise, participate in athletic competition or  
17 witness sports or other events, including sports pavilions,  
18 stadiums, gymnasiums, health spas, boxing arenas, swimming pools,  
19 roller and ice rinks and bowling alleys;

20 23. "Bar" and "tavern" means an establishment that derives more  
21 than sixty percent (60%) of its gross receipts, subject to  
22 verification by competent authority, from the sale of alcoholic  
23 beverages and low-point beer and no person under twenty-one (21)  
24 years of age is admitted, except for members of a musical band



1 employed or hired as provided in paragraph 2 of Section 6-102 of  
2 Title 37A of the Oklahoma Statutes, and that is not located within,  
3 and does not share any common entryway or common indoor area with,  
4 any other enclosed indoor workplace, including a restaurant; and

5 24. "Vapor product" means noncombustible products that may or  
6 may not contain nicotine that employ a mechanical heating element,  
7 battery, electronic circuit or other mechanism, regardless of shape  
8 or size, that can be used to produce a vapor in a solution or other  
9 form. Vapor products shall include any vapor cartridge or other  
10 container, with or without nicotine, or other form that is intended  
11 to be used with an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar,  
12 electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe or similar product or device  
13 and any vapor cartridge or other container of a solution that may or  
14 may not contain nicotine and that is intended to be used with or in  
15 an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo or  
16 electronic device. Vapor products do not include any products  
17 regulated by the United States Food and Drug Administration under  
18 Chapter V of the Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

19 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1535 of Title 63, unless there  
21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 All enclosed areas, including buildings and vehicles owned,  
23 leased, operated or contracted for use by the state or any of its  
24 subdivisions, as well as all outdoor property adjacent to such

1 buildings and under the control of the state, shall be subject to  
2 the provisions of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act.

3 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1536 of Title 63, unless there  
5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 A. Smoking shall be prohibited in all enclosed public places  
7 and indoor recreational areas within the State of Oklahoma,  
8 including, but not limited to, the following places:

- 9 1. Aquariums, galleries, libraries and museums;
- 10 2. Areas available to the general public in businesses and  
11 nonprofit entities patronized by the public, including, but not  
12 limited to, banks, laundromats, professional offices and retail  
13 service establishments;
- 14 3. Bars;
- 15 4. Bingo facilities;
- 16 5. Child care and adult day care facilities;
- 17 6. Convention facilities;
- 18 7. Educational facilities;
- 19 8. Elevators;
- 20 9. Health care facilities;
- 21 10. Hotels and motels;
- 22 11. Lobbies, hallways and other common areas in apartment  
23 buildings, condominiums, trailer parks, retirement facilities,  
24 nursing homes and other multiple-unit residential facilities;

- 1        12.    Parking structures;
- 2        13.    Polling places;
- 3        14.    Public transportation vehicles, including buses and  
4 taxicabs under the authority of the state, and public transportation  
5 facilities, including bus, train and airport facilities;
- 6        15.    Restaurants;
- 7        16.    Restrooms, lobbies, reception areas, hallways and other  
8 common-use areas;
- 9        17.    Retail stores;
- 10       18.    Rooms, chambers, places of meeting or public assembly,  
11 including school buildings, under the control of an agency, board,  
12 commission, committee or council of the state or a political  
13 subdivision of the state;
- 14       19.    Service lines;
- 15       20.    Shopping malls;
- 16       21.    Sports arenas, including enclosed places in outdoor arenas;  
17 and
- 18       22.    Theaters and other facilities primarily used for exhibiting  
19 motion pictures, stage dramas, lectures, musical recitals or other  
20 similar performances.
- 21       B.    The Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act shall not prohibit  
22 smoking in medical research or treatment centers, if smoking is  
23 integral to research or treatment.
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1 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1537 of Title 63, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. Smoking shall be prohibited in all enclosed areas of places  
5 of employment without exception. This includes, without limitation,  
6 work areas, auditoriums, classrooms, conference and meeting rooms,  
7 private offices, elevators, hallways, medical facilities,  
8 cafeterias, employee lounges, stairs, restrooms, vehicles and all  
9 other enclosed facilities, and any other spaces used or visited by  
10 employees.

11 B. This prohibition on smoking shall be communicated to all  
12 existing employees by the effective date of this act and to all  
13 prospective employees upon their application for employment.

14 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1538 of Title 63, unless there  
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 Smoking shall be prohibited in the following indoor and outdoor  
18 places:

- 19 1. All private clubs;
- 20 2. All private and semiprivate rooms in nursing homes;
- 21 3. All hotel and motel guest rooms;
- 22 4. Within twenty-five (25) feet of outside entrances, operable  
23 windows and ventilation systems of enclosed areas where smoking is  
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1 prohibited, so as to prevent tobacco smoke from entering those  
2 areas;

3 5. On all outdoor property that is adjacent to buildings owned,  
4 leased or operated by the state and that is under the control of the  
5 state;

6 6. In, and within twenty-five (25) feet of, outdoor seating or  
7 serving areas of restaurants and bars;

8 7. In outdoor shopping malls, including parking structures;

9 8. In all outdoor arenas, stadiums and amphitheaters. Smoking  
10 shall also be prohibited in, and within twenty-five (25) feet of,  
11 bleachers and grandstands for use by spectators at sporting and  
12 other public events;

13 9. In outdoor recreational areas, including parking lots;

14 10. In, and within twenty-five (25) feet of, all outdoor  
15 playgrounds;

16 11. In, and within twenty-five (25) feet of, all outdoor public  
17 events;

18 12. In, and within twenty-five (25) feet of, all outdoor public  
19 transportation stations, platforms and shelters under the authority  
20 of the state or any of its subdivisions;

21 13. In all outdoor service lines, including lines in which  
22 service is obtained by persons in vehicles, such as services that  
23 are provided by bank tellers, parking lot attendants and toll  
24 takers. In lines in which service is obtained by persons in

1 vehicles, smoking is prohibited by both pedestrians and persons in  
2 vehicles, but only within twenty-five (25) feet of the point of  
3 service; and

4 14. In outdoor common areas of apartment buildings,  
5 condominiums, trailer parks, retirement facilities, nursing homes  
6 and other multiple-unit residential facilities, except in designated  
7 smoking areas, not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the total  
8 outdoor common area, which must be located at least twenty-five (25)  
9 feet outside entrances, operable windows and ventilation systems of  
10 enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited.

11 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1539 of Title 63, unless there  
13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 Notwithstanding any other provision of the Oklahoma Workplace  
15 Clean Air Act to the contrary, smoking shall not be prohibited in  
16 private residences, unless used as a child care, adult day care or  
17 health care facility.

18 SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1540 of Title 63, unless there  
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 Notwithstanding any other provision of the Oklahoma Workplace  
22 Clean Air Act, an owner, operator, manager or other person in  
23 control of an establishment, facility or outdoor area may declare  
24 that entire establishment, facility or outdoor area as a nonsmoking

1 place. Smoking shall be prohibited in any place in which a sign  
2 conforming to the requirements of Section 9 of this act is posted.

3 SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1541 of Title 63, unless there  
5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 The owner, operator, manager or other person in control of a  
7 place of employment, public place, private club or residential  
8 facility where smoking is prohibited by the Oklahoma Workplace Clean  
9 Air Act shall:

10 1. Clearly and conspicuously post "No Smoking" signs or signs  
11 stating that the place is a smoke-free environment;

12 2. Clearly and conspicuously post signs at every entrance  
13 stating that smoking is prohibited or that the place is a smoke-free  
14 environment or, in the case of outdoor places, clearly and  
15 conspicuously post such signs in appropriate locations;

16 3. Clearly and conspicuously post on every vehicle that  
17 constitutes a place of employment under this act at least one sign,  
18 visible from the exterior of the vehicle, stating that smoking is  
19 prohibited or that the vehicle is a smoke-free environment; and

20 4. Remove all ashtrays from any area where smoking is  
21 prohibited by the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act, except for  
22 ashtrays displayed for sale and not for use on the premises.

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1 SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1542 of Title 63, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. No person or employer shall discharge, refuse to hire, or in  
5 any manner retaliate against an employee, applicant for employment,  
6 customer or resident of a multiple-unit residential facility because  
7 that employee, applicant, customer or resident exercises any rights  
8 afforded by the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act or reports or  
9 attempts to prosecute a violation of this act. In addition to any  
10 administrative fines imposed pursuant to Section 12 of this act, a  
11 conviction for a violation of this subsection shall be a  
12 misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars  
13 (\$1,000.00) for each violation.

14 B. An employee who works in a setting where an employer allows  
15 smoking does not waive or otherwise surrender any legal rights the  
16 employee may have against the employer or any other party.

17 SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1543 of Title 63, unless there  
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 The State Department of Health shall promulgate rules necessary  
21 to implement the provisions of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act.

22 SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1544 of Title 63, unless there  
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:



1       A. In addition to any other penalties authorized by law, the  
2 Commissioner of Health or the Department of Human Services,  
3 whichever is the appropriate entity, shall impose administrative  
4 fines against nursing facilities, employees of nursing facilities,  
5 or both nursing facilities and employees of nursing facilities,  
6 restaurants, food establishments and child care facilities for  
7 violations of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act.

8       B. Any citizen who desires to register a complaint under the  
9 Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act may do so with the State Department  
10 of Health.

11       C. Local health departments, fire departments and their  
12 designees shall, while an establishment is undergoing otherwise  
13 mandated inspections, inspect for compliance with the Oklahoma  
14 Workplace Clean Air Act.

15       D. An owner, manager, operator or employee of an area regulated  
16 by the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act shall direct a person who is  
17 smoking in violation of this act to extinguish or turn off the  
18 product being smoked. If the person does not stop smoking, the  
19 owner, manager, operator or employee shall refuse service and shall  
20 immediately ask the person to leave the premises. If the person in  
21 violation refuses to leave the premises, the owner, manager,  
22 operator or employee shall contact a law enforcement agency.

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1 E. Nothing in this section shall prevent an employee or private  
2 citizen from bringing legal action to enforce the Oklahoma Workplace  
3 Clean Air Act.

4 F. Nothing in this section shall prevent the State Department  
5 of Health from implementing a complaint system for the reporting of  
6 violations of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act.

7 SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1545 of Title 63, unless there  
9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 A. Any person who smokes in an area where smoking is prohibited  
11 by the provisions of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act shall be  
12 punished by a citation and fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars  
13 (\$100.00).

14 B. Except as otherwise provided in Section 10 of this act, a  
15 person who owns, manages, operates or otherwise controls a public  
16 place or place of employment and who fails to comply with the  
17 provisions of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act shall be punished  
18 by a citation and fine or an administrative fine in the following  
19 amounts:

20 1. A fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for a  
21 first violation;

22 2. A fine not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for a  
23 second violation within one (1) year; and  
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1           3. A fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each  
2 additional violation within one (1) year.

3           C. In addition to the fines established by this section,  
4 violation of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act by a person who  
5 owns, manages, operates or otherwise controls a public place or  
6 place of employment may result in the suspension or revocation of  
7 any permit or license issued to the person for the premises on which  
8 the violation occurred.

9           D. Violation of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act is hereby  
10 declared to be a public nuisance, which may be abated by restraining  
11 order, preliminary and permanent injunction or other means provided  
12 for by law.

13           E. Each day on which a violation of the Oklahoma Workplace  
14 Clean Air Act occurs shall be considered a separate and distinct  
15 violation.

16           SECTION 14.        NEW LAW        A new section of law to be codified  
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1546 of Title 63, unless there  
18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19           Nothing in the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act shall be  
20 construed to prevent a political subdivision of the state from  
21 adopting local ordinances or regulations relating to smoking in  
22 workplaces and public places that are more restrictive than this  
23 act, nor does this act repeal any existing local ordinances or  
24 regulations that provide restrictions on smoking that are

1 substantially equivalent to, or greater than, those provided by this  
2 act.

3 SECTION 15. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1547 of Title 63, unless there  
5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 The Department of Health shall engage in a continuing education  
7 program to explain and clarify the purposes and requirements of this  
8 act to citizens affected by it and to guide owners, operators and  
9 managers in their compliance with it. The program may include  
10 publication of a brochure for affected businesses and individuals  
11 explaining the provisions of the Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act.

12 SECTION 16. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1548 of Title 63, unless there  
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 The Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act shall not be interpreted or  
16 construed to permit smoking where it is otherwise restricted by  
17 other applicable state or local laws.

18 SECTION 17. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1549 of Title 63, unless there  
20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 The Oklahoma Workplace Clean Air Act shall be liberally  
22 construed so as to further its purposes.

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1 SECTION 18. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1247, as
