

1 2. Satisfies the criteria of paragraph 1 or 2 of subsection C
2 of Section 1020.2 of Title 82 of the Oklahoma Statutes; or

3 3. Is not to be permitted to operate for a period of more than
4 five (5) years, with no extensions or renewals; or

5 4. The operation of which will not result in more than five (5)
6 acre-feet per year of groundwater emanating from a sensitive sole
7 source groundwater basin or subbasin to infiltrate its pit, as that
8 term is defined in paragraph 12 of Section 723 of Title 45 of the
9 Oklahoma Statutes.

10 B. Due to the inadequacy of existing technical resources,
11 analytic tools and regulatory systems for purposes of the effective
12 implementation of statutes relating to the operation of mines that
13 may affect sensitive sole source groundwater basins or subbasins,
14 the Legislature hereby declares and establishes a moratorium on the
15 following actions:

16 1. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board shall not issue any
17 permit or other administrative authorization for the appropriation,
18 diversion, withdrawal or removal of water from or for the
19 dewatering, in part or in full, of a pit, as defined in paragraph 12
20 of Section 723 of Title 45 of the Oklahoma Statutes, of a subject
21 mine; and

22 2. The Board shall not issue, allocate or recognize, pursuant
23 to subsection D of Section 1020.2 of Title 82 of the Oklahoma
24 Statutes, Section 785:30-15-5 of the Oklahoma Administrative Code or

1 any other provision of law, any offset to the consumptive use of
2 water of a subject mine where such offset is based on a claimed
3 augmentation of stream flow or groundwater.

4 C. The moratorium shall be in effect until such time as the
5 Board, working in coordination with the Department of Environmental
6 Quality, the Department of Mines, and East Central University and in
7 cooperation with federal and tribal governmental agencies with
8 interests in a subject mine that overlies a sensitive sole source
9 groundwater basin or subbasin:

10 1. Completes the Enhanced Monitoring and Evaluation of
11 Hydrologic Trends for the Eastern Arbuckle-Simpson Aquifer, South-
12 Central Oklahoma and, based thereon, develops modeling and other
13 technical tools capable of accurately measuring and projecting, as a
14 matter both of incremental and cumulative effect, whether a proposed
15 withdrawal of groundwater from a sensitive sole source groundwater
16 basin or subbasin would degrade or interfere with springs and
17 streams emanating therefrom;

18 2. Promulgates final rules to integrate the use of such studies
19 and tools to administrative implementation of:

20 a. waste, degradation and interference analyses required
21 by subparagraphs c and d of paragraph 1 and
22 subparagraphs c and d of paragraph 2 of subsection A
23 of Section 1020.9 of Title 82 of the Oklahoma
24 Statutes,

1 b. uniform minimum standards and requirements for the
2 development of, and annual reporting regarding
3 compliance with, site-specific water management and
4 conservation plans pursuant to Section 1020.2 of Title
5 82 of the Oklahoma Statutes, with particular regard to
6 methodologies for calculating amounts claimed in
7 consumptive use of water and any claimed augmentation
8 of stream flow or groundwater, and

9 c. consultation, review and approval of such site-
10 specific water management and conservation plans, with
11 specific provisions for making such consultations,
12 reviews and approvals subject to Article 2 of the
13 Administrative Procedures Act; and

14 3. Promulgates final rules to provide for effective interagency
15 consultation and coordination of activities among the Board, the
16 Department of Mines and the Department of Environmental Quality on
17 all administrative matters relating to the operation of mines at
18 locations that overlie a sensitive sole source groundwater basin or
19 subbasin.

20 D. The Board is hereby authorized and instructed to promulgate
21 rules to implement the provisions of this section.

22 E. The Board is hereby authorized to cooperate with federal,
23 tribal and any other agency in this state in performing its
24 responsibilities under this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
