11                                   COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

12                   An Act relating to drugs, devices and cosmetics;  
13                   creating certain labeling requirements for  
14                   cannabidiol; providing applicability of section;  
15                   providing for retail sales of hemp; providing for  
16                   codification; and providing an effective date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18                   SECTION 1.           NEW LAW           A new section of law to be codified  
19                   in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1431 of Title 63, unless there  
20                   is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21                   A. Any manufactured product containing cannabidiol, as provided  
22                   for in Section 2-101 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, shall  
23                   include a label which contains, at a minimum:

24                   1. The country of origin of the cannabidiol; and

1           2. Whether the cannabidiol is synthetic or natural.

2           B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any  
3 pharmaceutical product approved by the Food and Drug Administration.

4           C. Retail sales of industrial hemp and hemp products may be  
5 conducted without a license so long as the products and the hemp  
6 used in the products were grown and cultivated legally in another  
7 state or jurisdiction and meet the same or substantially the same  
8 requirements for processing hemp products or growing hemp. The  
9 addition of derivatives of hemp, including hemp-derived cannabidiol,  
10 to cosmetics, personal care products and products intended for human  
11 or animal consumption shall be permitted without a license and shall  
12 not be considered an adulteration of such products.

13           SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
