NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-4-208 of Title 10A, unless 20 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 21 A. Every child taken into custody by the Department of Human 22 Services pursuant to the Oklahoma Children's Code shall be given a 23 24

1	standardized assessment within twenty-one (21) days of entering
2	custody, unless otherwise prescribed by the assessment.
3	B. The assessment shall evaluate the physical, developmental,
4	medical, mental health and educational needs of the child and shall
5	be considered when developing placement and service plans for the
6	child.
7	C. The assessment shall be updated by the Department at regular
8	intervals while the child is in the custody of the Department to
9	ensure the needs of the child are being addressed and changes are
LO	being documented.
L1	D. The Department may promulgate rules to implement the
L2	provisions of this section.
L3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
