L7	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 72 O.S. 2011, Section 7, as
L8	amended by Section 1, Chapter 86, O.S.L. 2014 (72 O.S. Supp. 2019,
L 9	Section 7), is amended to read as follows:
20	Section 7. A. All honorably discharged veterans who are
21	currently Oklahoma residents shall be allowed free admission to all
22	state-owned or state-operated parks and museums. A valid Oklahoma
23	driver license or state photo identification card and military
24	discharge papers (DD Form 214) or similar evidence of an honorable

- discharge from the United States Armed Forces shall be required for

 free admission For state parks, veterans shall receive free

 admission for one vehicle, which must be pre-registered with the

 Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department using appropriate veteran

 documentation. For museums, veterans must show appropriate veteran

 documentation at time of entry.
- B. A For purposes of this section, appropriate veteran

 documentation consists of a valid Oklahoma driver license or

 identification card issued by the Department of Public Safety with

 a, and either:
 - 1. A flag emblem and the word "veteran" in the upper left-hand corner of the front of the driver license or identification card shall be sufficient for free admission to all state-owned and state-operated parks and museums; or
 - 2. Military discharge papers (United States Department of

 Defense Form 214) or similar evidence of an honorable discharge from
 the United States Armed Forces.
 - SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
