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10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
11	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
12	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-133 of Title 70, unless there
13	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
14	A. As used in this section:
15	1. "Provider" means an eligible entity that seeks or has
16	obtained approval of an alternative teacher preparation program
17	consistent with this section; and
18	2. "Program" means content provided by a provider that leads
19	toward licensure in a specific content area.
20	B. The State Board of Education shall identify providers to
21	implement new and innovative pathways toward teacher certification
22	on a pilot program basis. Providers seeking to participate in the
23	pilot program shall submit applications to the State Board of
24	Education.

C. A provider chosen by the State Board of Education to
 participate in the pilot program shall offer a program that:

3 1. Provides evidence and history of fiscal solvency, capacity,
4 operation and program effectiveness;

2. Provides evidence of necessary infrastructure to provide
accurate, timely and secure data for the purpose of admission,
teacher candidate monitoring, testing and certification
recommendations;

9 3. Has policies and procedures in place ensuring the security10 of teacher candidate records under applicable laws and regulations;

11 4. Has the instructional capacity or ability to obtain the 12 instructional capacity to provide adequate instruction in accordance 13 with this subsection;

14 5. Offers an instructional phase that provides intensive 15 preparation before the teacher candidates assume classroom 16 responsibilities;

17 6. Offers a research-based and results-oriented approach
18 focused on best teaching practices to increase student achievement
19 and growth measured against state academic standards;

20 7. Provides assessment, supervision and evaluation of teacher
21 candidates to determine their specific needs throughout the program
22 and to support efforts to successfully complete the program;

8. Provides intensive and ongoing professional development
opportunities that accelerate a teacher candidate's professional

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growth, support student learning and provide a workplace
 orientation, professional staff development and mentoring;

3 9. Offers peer review focused on standards of professional4 practice and continuous professional growth; and

5 10. Provides a process to review a teacher candidate's final 6 competency of required certification content standards that leads to 7 a potential candidate being recommended for teacher certification in 8 accordance with subsection F of this section.

9 D. The State Board of Education shall ensure that providers approved to participate in the pilot program allow teacher 10 11 candidates to demonstrate pedagogy and content standard proficiency 12 in school-based programs and through other nontraditional means. Nontraditional means may include but not be limited to previous work 13 experience, teacher experience, educator evaluations, industry-14 15 recognized certifications and other essentially equivalent demonstrations. 16

E. If the State Board of Education determines that a provider fails to meet or is deficient in any of the requirements of this section, it may suspend or revoke the approval of the provider after providing notification of the deficiencies and an opportunity to remedy the deficiencies.

F. A teacher candidate that completes a program offered by an approved provider shall be eligible for certification, provided he or she meets the certification requirements set forth in Section 6-

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187 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes in the area of
 specialization for which certification is sought and is recommended
 for certification by the approved provider.

The State Board of Education shall issue a certificate to G. 4 5 teach to any person who meets the requirements set forth in this section and who has on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 6 7 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 8 9 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 10 The person applying for the certificate shall be responsible for the 11 cost of the criminal history records.

12 H. A provider shall submit a report to the State Department of Education after one year of operation showing the percentage of 13 teacher candidates who have completed the program and who have 14 15 successfully completed or who have failed the competency examinations for certification and the provider's efforts to help 16 candidates successfully pass the examinations. A provider shall 17 annually submit evidence to the State Department of Education after 18 the pilot year with evidence of the success of the program. 19

I. The State Board of Education may promulgate rules toimplement the provisions of this section.

22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
23 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
24 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
