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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-315.1 of Title 63, unless
20	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. If a death certificate is required to settle a property or
22	financial interest for a person who has allegedly died in the state
23	twenty-five (25) years ago or longer, and the following
24	determinations have been made:

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- 1 1. The State Registrar of Vital Records has confirmed that a death certificate is not on file with the State Department of Health;
 - The State Registrar of Vital Records has determined that all due diligence has been performed and the requirement of Section 1-317 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes for filing a death certificate cannot be met; and
 - The State Registrar of Vital Records has determined that all due diligence has been performed and the requirements of Section 1-314 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the filing of a delayed death certificate cannot be met,
- 12 then a verified petition may be filed with the district court of the 13 county where the death allegedly occurred for an order establishing 14 a judicial record of death.
- 15 The verified petition shall, at a minimum, contain the 16 following:
 - The full legal name of the alleged decedent;
 - The date and place of birth of the decedent; 2.
 - 3. The age of the decedent;

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- 4. The date and place of the death of the decedent;
- 5. The property or financial interest to be resolved;
- 22 6. The determinations of the State Registrar of Vital Records 23 as required in paragraphs 2 and 3 of subsection A of this section; 24 and

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- 7. Other facts as deemed pertinent by the court, including, but not limited to, the names of the parents of the decedent or the name of the spouse of the decedent.
- C. Upon the filing of the verified petition, the court clerk of the county where the petition is filed shall assign the petition a number in the probate files of the county.
- D. Notice of the verified petition shall be given to the State Department of Health and published once in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where the verified petition is filed.
- E. Based on the verified petition; all the evidence in the possession of the applicant, which may consist of personal testimony, affidavits or records; and determinations of the State Registrar of Vital Records as required in paragraphs 2 and 3 of subsection A of this section, the court may enter an order establishing:
 - 1. The full legal name of the decedent;
 - 2. The date and place of birth of the decedent;
 - 3. The age of the decedent;

- 4. The date and place where the death occurred;
- 5. The property or financial interest to be resolved; and
- 6. Other facts as deemed pertinent by the court and as set forth in the verified petition.

The order shall be final and conclusive of all the adjudged facts.

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- F. A certified copy of the order may be filed with the State

 Department of Health. If filed with the Department, the Department shall issue a certified copy of the order in the same manner as death certificates are issued.
- G. Provided the State Registrar of Vital Records has made the determinations required in paragraphs 2 and 3 of subsection A of this section, then a certified copy of the order issued by the Department shall satisfy any and all requirements set forth in any statute requiring a death certificate or order of any court requiring the issuance of a death certificate.
- 11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.

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
