7	An Act relating to schools; creating the Teacher Incentive Program; awarding certain amount of tuition
8	exemption for certain eligible persons; providing eligibility requirements; limiting additional
9	exemption award; terminating tuition exemption under certain circumstances; providing penalty for
10	exemption termination; providing exemption application procedure; providing for application of
11	certain federal educational benefits; disqualifying persons in default on certain loans; prohibiting
12	consideration of tuition exemption in decision of admission to higher education program; requiring the
13	Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and institutions for higher education to coordinate and
14	share information; authorizing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to promulgate rules;

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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
20	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
21	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Teacher
22	Incentive Program".
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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2525 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. An institution of higher education of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall exempt up to two hundred two (202) persons annually selected by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education from the payment of tuition, dues, fees and other required charges, including fees for correspondence courses but excluding general deposit fees, student services fees and any fees or charges for lodging, board or clothing, in an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per individual award.
- B. An individual may be eligible to receive the exemption provided subsection A of this section if the individual:
- 1. Currently resides in this state and is determined to be a resident of this state for the purpose of resident tuition at the time the person is accepted or enrolled at an institution of higher education of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education;
- 2. Has been accepted or is enrolled at an institution of higher education of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education;
- 3. Intends to become certified to teach through completion of an accredited teacher preparation program; and
- 4. Intends to teach and become employed to serve as district superintendent, principal, supervisor, a counselor, librarian, school nurse or classroom teacher or in any other instructional,

supervisory or administrative capacity in this state for no less
than four (4) years within ten (10) years after his or her
certification to teach is issued.

- C. Once an individual is awarded an exemption, the individual shall be ineligible to receive an additional award.
- D. If any individual is awarded an exemption under the provisions of this section and fails to become certified to teach through completion of an accredited teacher preparation program or fails to become employed to serve as district superintendent, principal, supervisor, a counselor, librarian, school nurse or classroom teacher or in any other instructional, supervisory or administrative capacity in this state for no less than four (4) years within ten (10) years after his or her certification to teach is issued shall result in the termination of the tuition exemption provided by this section. If the tuition exemption is terminated as provided in this subsection, the amount of the exemption shall be required to be repaid together with eight percent (8%) interest per annum.
- E. Each institution of higher education granting an exemption under this section shall require each applicant claiming the exemption to submit to the institution, in the form and manner prescribed by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, an application for the exemption and necessary evidence that the applicant qualifies for the exemption.

F. The exemption from tuition, fees and other charges provided for by this section shall not apply to a person who at the time of registration is entitled to receive educational benefits under federal law that may be used only for the payment of tuition and fees if the value of those benefits received in a semester or other term is equal to or exceeds the value of the exemption for the same semester or other term. If the value of federal benefits that may be used only for the payment of tuition and fees and are received in a semester or term does not equal or exceed the value of the exemption for the same semester or term, the person is entitled to receive both those federal benefits and the exemption in the same semester or term. The combined amount of the federal benefit that may be used only for the payment of tuition and fees plus the amount of the exemption received in a semester or term may not exceed the cost of tuition and fees for that semester or term.

- G. A person shall not receive an exemption under this section if the person is in default on a loan made or guaranteed for educational purposes by the State of Oklahoma.
- H. In determining whether to admit a person to any certificate program or any baccalaureate, graduate, postgraduate or professional degree program, an institution of higher education may not consider the fact that the person is eligible for an exemption under this section.

- I. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the institutions of higher education of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall coordinate to provide each respective entity with any information required to ensure the proper administration of this section and the proper execution of each entity's statutory responsibilities concerning this section.
- J. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall develop performance requirements for individuals awarded an exemption under this section to ensure the participating individual meets the requirements set forth in this section and may adopt rules to provide for any additional eligibility requirements and for the efficient and uniform application of this section.
- SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
