HB 1054 expands the definition of violent crime to include domestic abuse by strangulation, domestic assault with a dangerous weapon, domestic battery with a dangerous or deadly weapon, or domestic assault and battery with a dangerous or deadly weapon.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1054 expands the definition of violent crimes to include several domestic wrongdoings. This makes those committed of the crimes listed ineligible for pardon or parole. The overall impact is contingent upon how many individuals are convicted. Currently, it costs DOC an average of \$58.70/day or \$21,425.50/year to incarcerate one person in its custody.
