HB 1056 adds assault and battery with intent to cause great bodily harm by strangulation or attempted strangulation as an offense requiring a person to serve 85% of the sentence imposed before being eligible for parole consideration.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 1056 adds assault and battery with intent to cause great bodily harm to the list of 85% crimes. This could increase the number of future inmates required to serve 85% of their sentences before they are eligible for parole. Ultimately the overall impact is contingent upon the number of people found guilty of the crime. The average cost of incarceration for one inmate in DOC custody is \$58.70/day or \$21,425.50/year.
