**Research Analysis**

HB 1992, as introduced, authorizes the governing body of a municipality to initiate creation of a public safety protection district. A resolution would be submitted to the municipality's voters for their approval. The district would include all territory located in the municipality, be managed by the municipal government, and be considered a political subdivision of the state. A public safety protection district may institute a property tax of no more than 5 mills on the dollar of assessed value, for the purpose of funding public safety protections, including law enforcement, fire safety, housing of prisoners in the county or municipal jail, or emergency medical services.
