Research Analysis

The Proposed Committee Substitute for HB 2119 clarifies the method for determining signature requirements for municipal initiative petitions. A petition must have be signed by a number of registered voters equal to 25% of the total number of votes cast in the preceding general election. The measure clarifies that this election means the most recent preceding general municipal election.

The bill further specifies that the *total number of votes cast* is to mean the sum of the votes cast for all candidates in the highest-ranking at-large municipal race on the ballot.
