**Research Analysis**

The PCS for HB 2149 creates an annual pet store license under the jurisdiction of the Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry (ODAFF). The measure sets out certain requirements for dogs, including that:

- the store acquire dogs in a certain way;
- the dogs are at least 8 weeks old;
- the dogs are microchipped; and
- the dogs are not sold to minors.

The measure grants ODAFF the authority to:

- set the license fee;
- refuse or revoke pet store licenses; and
- use the newly created Pet Store License Revolving Fund to enforce the provisions of the act.

The measure creates penalties for first, second and third violations at \$500; \$2,500; and \$10,000, respectively.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure, per the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry would require five (5) new inspectors and two (2) administrative assistants, See breakdown below. The agency anticipates a negative fiscal impact of \$453, 262.50.

**Inspector** Salary each \$55,461/annual  
Travel expense each \$9,165  
Lodging cost each \$4,582.50  
Total for Five (5): \$346,042.50

**Administrative Assist.** Salary each \$53,610/annual  
Total for Two (2): \$107,220
