**Research Analysis**

HB2594 creates the Seizure-Safe Schools Act and requires each public school district, and governing board of each private and parochial school, to have at least one school employee who has met training requirements necessary to recognize symptoms of seizures and administer seizure medicine. The measure lists requirements for the training programs of such school personnel. HB2594 requires students' parents or legal guardians to follow specific procedures before seizure medication can be administered to their child at school.

The measure also requires public school students and other public school staff to receive training on seizures and seizure disorders.

Finally, HB2594 directs the State Board of Education to promulgate rules for the development and implementation of the seizure education program and procedures for the development and content of seizure action plans.
