## **Research Analysis**

The Senate amendments to HB2613 authorizes podiatrists to recommend medical marijuana to patients. The amendments authorize the Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners to issue guidance to podiatric physicians on the recommending of medical marijuana, and to take disciplinary action against any podiatric physician who willfully violates the provisions of Section 420 et seq. of Title 63.

The amendments also authorize:

- The State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to issue guidance to allopathic physicians on the recommending of medical marijuana
- The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners to issue guidance to all osteopathic physicians on the recommending of medical marijuana.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

After analysis, the measure, pertaining to medical marijuana and to physician classifications defined under the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act, simply expands definitions and regulatory requirements relating to physicians who are allowed to make marijuana recommendations to patients.
