**Research Analysis**

HB 2651 provides a definition of “bottle service” as used in the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act to mean the sale and provision of spirits in their original packages by a mixed beverage licensee to be consumed in that mixed beverage licensee's club suite. The measure provides a definition of “club suite” to mean a designated area within the premises of a mixed beverage licensee as an exclusive space. The measure allows a mixed beverage license holder to sell spirits in a club suite.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2651, which expands the function of a mixed beverage license, upon review and with consultation with ABLE, is determined to have a minimal positive impact on state revenues. There is the possibility that some licensees may opt for this (more expensive) license over a beer and wine, but that number is unknown.
