**Research Analysis**

HB 3300, as introduced, creates the “Students’ Right to Know Act” with the purpose of helping high school students make informed decisions about their futures.

The measure requires the State Department of Education to compile and distribute information to high schools regarding the state’s most in-demand jobs, including average salary, and education level required for those positions, and the average cost of the state’s major colleges, universities, and vocational schools, among other things.
