Fiscal Analysis

Section 1 provides for a limit of \$58,858,503 for the purpose of providing an increase in compensation for certified personnel in addition to the step increase indicated in the minimum salary schedule.

Section 2 provides for the following:

- \$2,411,771,057 for the financial support of public schools.
- \$636,610,946 for additional program areas.
- \$16,246,097 for administrative and support functions of the Oklahoma State Department of Education for a total of \$3,064,628,100.

Section 3 provides for budget categories.

Section 4 provides for \$3,161,477 to be transferred to the School Consolidation Assistance Fund.

Section 5 provides for \$3,161,477 to be transferred to the Teachers' Retirement System Dedicated Revenue Revolving Fund.

Section 6 provides the allocation of funds for the purpose of funding related to the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma.

Section 7 provides for funds to be allocated for Education Leadership Oklahoma as follows:

- \$3,625,000 to the Oklahoma National Board Certification Revolving Fund for the purposes of awarding annual bonuses.
- \$2,038,548 to the Oklahoma School Psychologist, Speech-language Pathologist, and Audiologist National Certification Revolving Fund for the purposes of awarding annual bonuses.

Section 8 provides for funds to be allocated for Reform Implementation as follows:

- \$1,300,000 for the Advanced Placement Teacher Training and Test Fee Assistance.
- \$12,000,000 for Reading Sufficiency.
- \$150,000 for the Teacher Induction Program.
- \$150,000 for development and implementation of standards.

- \$250,000 for Teacher and Leader Effectiveness Programs.
- \$9,600,000 for required assessments.
- \$2,000,000 for the Teach for America Program.
- \$180,000 for Street School.
- \$200,000 for the Oklahoma Arts Institute.
- \$38,000 for Ag in the Classroom.

Section 9 provides for funds to be expended for Alternative and High Challenge Education in the amount of \$11,000,000.

Section 10 provides for funds allocation for Early Intervention.

Section 11 provides for funds allocation for the Secure Schools Program.

Section 12 provides for funds allocation for the Early Childhood Initiative.

Section 13 provides for duties and compensation of certain employees.

Section 14 relates to the possibility of reduction of state aid funds.

Section 15 relates to the certain authorization of funds transfer.

Section 16 relates to certain proportionate funds reduction.

Section 17 provides certain budget and funding dates.

Section 18 provides an effective date.

Section 19 provides for an emergency.
