**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for SB 238 requires any product containing cannabidiol to contain a label showing the country of origin and whether the cannabidiol is synthetic or natural. The measure states that the measure shall not apply to any pharmaceutical product approved by the Food and Drug Administration.

The committee substitute for SB238 allows for the retail sales of industrial hemp without a license. The addition of derivatives of hemp, including hemp-derived cannabidiol, to cosmetics, personal care products and products intended for human or animal consumption shall also be permitted without a license.
