## **Research Analysis**

SB 708 allows a city council or board of trustees for a city or municipality to, through a majority vote of the council or board, designate city or municipality personnel who have been issued a handgun license pursuant to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act to attend an armed security guard training program, or a reserve peace officer certification program. Participation by the personnel is voluntary. The governing body of the city or municipality may also pay the costs for attending the training program. Any employee who completes the training program shall be immune to civil and criminal liability arising from an injury related to firearms on city property. Each governing body is authorized by the measure to enter into a memorandum of understanding with local law enforcement entities.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

SB 708, which deals with private security and reserve academy training, upon review and with consultation from the Council on Law Enforcement, Education, and Training (CLEET), it is determined to have no fiscal considerations for the agency. CLEET does not directly provide either training. Technology centers and some private entities provide all armed guard training and local law enforcement agencies host reserve academies. CLEET already provides oversight for these academies: therefore, there is no change in their duties and no fiscal impact on the state.
