Impact:	Possible minimal positive revenue increase to the courts and OSBI from fees

Research Analysis

SB 815 allows the court to give leave to a person not otherwise eligible to file for a motion of expungement. The motion must be accompanied with a written statement of the facts deemed relevant about the crime from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the arresting agency, and the district attorney. The FS also modifies the requirements to file for expungement to include a person convicted of a felony, excepting 85% crimes or sex offenders, who previously completed his or her prison sentence at least ten years ago.

Fiscal Analysis

SB 815, which expands the pool of individuals eligible to file a motion for expungement, is determined to have a minimal positive revenue impact on the state. The overall impact is dependent upon how many more people are filing motions and paying the associated fees to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) and the courts. Currently, expungement applications can cost an individual a maximum of:

- \$15 to OSBI for a criminal history report
- \$150 to OSBI to record the Agreed Expungement Order
- Up to \$175 of court fees
