Committee Substitute (CS)

The CS for HB 1022 creates the Task Force on Trauma-Informed Care. The Task Force shall be comprised of 26 members, who shall each serve at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority. Initial appointments to the Task Force must be made no later than December 31, 2019. The Task Force will study and make recommendations on a statewide, coordinated approach to preventing trauma in children, particularly the adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) associated with negative health and well-being outcomes across the life span. Members shall serve without compensation, but may receive compensation for travel. The Task Force shall publish its findings and recommendations and shall disband on January 1, 2022. The measure repeals a similar, existing Task Force.
