**Committee Substitute (CS)**

The CS for SB 212 removes language requiring the initial allocation of State Aid for virtual charter schools to be based on actual enrollment multiplied by 1.333 for each initial allocation. It removes language directing the weighted membership of nonresident, transferred students enrolled in online courses to be based on the weighted average daily membership of the preceding school year. The bill also states that the weighted calculation for a statewide virtual charter school that experiences a significant decline in membership is to be based on the first nine weeks of the current school year rather than the preceding school year or the second preceding school year. It defines “significant decline in membership” as a decrease of 15% or more in the average daily membership from the preceding school year to the first nine weeks of the current school year.
