Committee Substitute (CS)

The CS for SB 729 establishes the state's right to preempt local laws regulating businesses and occupations licensed, regulated and controlled under the supervision of the Department of Consumer Credit. No municipality or other political subdivision shall adopt or enforce any order pertaining to the scope and practice of the business, the registration or permitting of the business, regulation of interest, or the physical location of the business. Municipalities and political subdivision may adopt ordinances pertaining to the sales tax, the general health and welfare of the public, signage and parking hours, and the construction and building codes. The CS creates a grandfather clause for businesses established prior to the effective date of this measure.
