**Bill Analysis**

SB 86 clarifies that a person convicted of assaulting any medical care providers is guilty of a felony punishable up to two years imprisonment. The measure also clarifies that medical care providers means doctors, residents, interns, nurses, nurses' aides, ambulance attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, and members of a hospital security force.
