**Bill Analysis**

SB 951 removes the requirement for the Oklahoma Department of Human Services to consult with the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth when appointing the advisory committee comprised of representatives of child care facilities. The measure also removes the statutory requirements for the committee's membership. The advisory committee, as directed by the measure, is also required to provide advice regarding concerns brought by child care facilities or referred by the Department to assist facilities in meeting minimum requirements.

A majority of any advisory committee must be made up of the type of child care facility affected by the minimum requirements prepared by the Department. The measure also places the appointment authority relating to the Child Care Facility Peer Review Board under the advisory committee.
