PROPOSAL: Amendatory

The measure proposes amendment to Section 3106.4 of Title 74 requiring public bodies that collect personally identifiable data to make available on its Internet website, or on a general website if a public body uses a general website, the following:

- What personally identifiable data is being stored;
- How the personally identifiable data is stored; and
- With whom the public body shares the personally identifiable data.

It further defines "personally identifiable data" to mean information which can identify an individual including, but not limited to, name, birth date, place of birth, mother's maiden name, biometric records, Social Security number, official state- or government-issued driver license or identification number, alien registration number, government passport number, employer or taxpayer identification number or any other information that is linked or linkable to an individual, such as medical, educational, financial or employment information.
