 - 1. Harm reduction by connecting individuals in need with treatment programs and social services;

 - 3. Intensive outreach by engaging participants in the community to help maintain and improve their level of engagement with services:
 - 4. Use of professional staff, peer supports and partnerships to connect participants with available community services and economic supports; and
 - 5. Use of evidence-based reentry programs.
- C. The purpose of the post-conviction clemency pilot program
 shall be to:
