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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-317d of Title 63, unless there
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. When the death of an infant occurs in this state, a medical
17	examiner shall conduct a sudden unexplained infant death
18	investigation (SUIDI) not more than forty-eight (48) hours after the
19	death has occurred. The medical examiner or an individual who has
20	passed the registry examination of the American Board of Medicolegal
21	Death Investigators shall interview the parent, legal guardian or
22	caregiver of, or person who last had contact with, the deceased
23	infant and shall fill out the Centers for Disease Control and
24 23	Prevention's SUIDI reporting form accordingly. The Department shall

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¹ retain a copy of each SUIDI reporting form in order to compile
² accurate and reliable data on SUIDI to aid and inform the policies
³ of the Department.

B. As used in this section, "medical examiner" means the Chief
Medical Examiner, the Deputy Chief Medical Examiner or a medical
examiner appointed by the Chief Medical Examiner pursuant to Section
937 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

8 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
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
