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, 8	An Act relating to public school textbooks; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 16-111, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 253, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp.
9	2018, Section 16-111), which relates to textbook committees; directing school principals to appoint
10	building-level textbook committees; providing for membership; directing superintendents of certain
11	schools to appoint district-level textbook committees; modifying references; providing for
12	membership; requiring certain administrator to serve on the district-level textbook committee; allowing
13	members of textbook committees to receive compensation; requiring certain textbook plan to be
14	affirmatively approved by certain majority; requiring certain textbook order to be affirmatively approved by certain majority; removing language allowing
15	school districts to be exempt from certain requirements when the state financial support of
16	public schools is below certain amount; amending 70
17	0.S. 2011, Section 16-111.1, which relates to supplementary textbooks and materials; prohibiting
18	certain funds from being used for certain purposes; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 16-114a, as last
19	amended by Section 4, Chapter 253, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 16-114a), which relates to
20	textbook allocations; increasing amount to be used in calculation of certain initial allocation; removing
21	language directing school districts seeking certain flexibility to make certain demonstration to the
22	State Board of Education; modifying references; providing an effective date; and declaring an
23	emergency.

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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 2 SECTION 1. 70 O.S. 2011, Section 16-111, as AMENDATORY 3 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 253, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 4 2018, Section 16-111), is amended to read as follows: 5 Section 16-111. A. Except as otherwise provided for in 6 subsection E of this section, the The principal of each public 7 school site shall appoint a building-level textbook committee 8 consisting of one teacher for each grade level to include a 9 representative for each content area in the adoption cycle and 10 representatives for special education and English language learner 11 teachers. The superintendent of schools of each independent or 12 dependent public school district in the state shall appoint a local 13 district-level textbook committee consisting of not fewer than three 14 nor more than nine members one member from each building-level 15 textbook committee. Each committee shall have one lay member, with 16 the remainder of the members being teachers employed in the public 17 schools of the district, a majority all of whom shall be classroom 18 teachers. The superintendent of schools or a designee who shall be 19 a principal or a curriculum specialist shall serve as a non-voting 20 chairperson of the local district-level textbook committee. The 21 district's administrator with the authority to approve the 22 expenditure of textbook funds shall also serve on the district-level 23 committee so that budgetary issues can be addressed during the 24 adoption process. \_ \_

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1 B. Upon the written request of any duly appointed local 2 textbook coordinator, the publisher of a textbook selected by the 3 State Textbook Committee shall furnish at least one examination copy 4 of the textbook and the teacher edition of the textbook, if one is 5 published, and a copy of software for purposes of complete 6 demonstration and review, if available, to the school district so 7 that the local district-level textbook committee may examine any or 8 all new adoptions in the subjects taught or to be taught in schools 9 in the district.

10 C. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection E of this 11 section, on On or before a date to be fixed by the State Board of 12 Education, each local district-level textbook committee shall adopt 13 textbooks from the multiple list selected by the State Textbook 14 Committee in a manner as shall be prescribed by the State Board of 15 Education. Each local Members of each district-level and building-16 level textbook committee shall serve without compensation and may be 17 compensated with extra duty pay to cover the time and labor expended 18 to serve on the building-level or district-level textbook 19 committees. The committees shall cease to exist when local 20 adoptions have been completed and shall be replaced by another local 21 district-level textbook committee appointed in the same manner as 22 provided for in this section.

D. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection E of this
 section, on On or before a date to be fixed by the State Board of

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1 Education, the superintendent of each independent or dependent 2 public school district shall submit to the State Board of Education 3 a textbook plan outlining the estimated number of textbooks needed 4 by the school district and the total amount of money to be expended 5 by the district for textbooks including the allocated funds and any 6 additional supplemental funds to be expended. The plan shall be 7 affirmatively approved by a majority of the district-level textbook 8 committee members as evidenced by a cover letter signed by the 9 members and attached to the district's textbook plan. The 10 superintendent or textbook coordinator appointed by the 11 superintendent, shall place orders from the proper depository or 12 depositories for all of the textbooks needed as outlined in the 13 textbook plan by the district for the ensuing year. The order shall 14 be affirmatively approved by a majority of the district-level 15 textbook committee members as evidenced by a cover letter signed by 16 the members and attached to the district's textbook order. The 17 superintendent of a school district or textbook coordinator may 18 order any textbooks placed on the official multiple textbook list. 19 If the order exceeds the allocation for each school district as 20 provided in Section 16-114a of this title any additional funds 21 expended shall be reported on the statement of expenditures for the 22 district.

E. 1. If a school district makes the election as provided for in subsection B of Section 16-114a of this title, the district shall <sup>1</sup> not be required to appoint a local textbook committee, adopt
<sup>2</sup> textbooks, submit a textbook plan, or expend money on the purchase
<sup>3</sup> of textbooks during any fiscal year as provided for in this
<sup>4</sup> subsection.

5 2. The provisions of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall cease 6 to be effective during a fiscal year immediately following a fiscal 7 year that the state financial support of public schools provides an 8 amount equal to or more than Three Thousand Two Hundred Ninety-one 9 Dollars and sixty cents (\$3,291.60) per weighted average daily 10 membership as calculated pursuant to Section 18-200.1 of this title 11 and reported to school districts by the State Department of 12 Education on the initial tentative State Aid allocation notice. 13 3. If the amount set and calculated as provided for in 14 paragraph 2 of this subsection is reduced by one percent (1%) or 15 more as reported to school districts by the Department on the 16 initial tentative State Aid allocation notice for the following 17 fiscal year, the provisions of paragraph 2 of this subsection shall 18 cease to be effective and the provisions of paragraph 1 of this 19 subsection shall continue to be effective.

20SECTION 2.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 16-111.1, is21amended to read as follows:

Section 16-111.1. The funds allocated for textbooks in Section 16-114a of this title may be used by a school district for supplementary textbooks and other instructional materials other than

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<sup>1</sup> those selected and listed by the State Textbook Committee <u>that are</u> <sup>2</sup> <u>approved for purchase by the district-level textbook committee</u> <sup>3</sup> pursuant to Section 16-111 of this title.

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 16-114a, as
last amended by Section 4, Chapter 253, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp.
2018, Section 16-114a), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 16-114a. A. Based upon legislative appropriations, the 8 State Board of Education shall determine the textbook allocation to 9 be distributed to each independent or dependent public school 10 district in the state. Each year the textbook allocation for each 11 independent or dependent public school district shall be calculated 12 and distributed in July and adjusted in December. The initial 13 allocation shall be calculated based on the audited end-of-year 14 average daily attendance of the preceding school year multiplied by 15 Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00) Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). The 16 initial allocation shall be calculated and distributed to each 17 independent or dependent public school district in July. The 18 December adjustment shall be calculated by multiplying the audited 19 first nine (9) weeks' average daily attendance for that current 20 school year by Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00) Two Hundred Dollars 21 (\$200.00) and subtracting from that amount the amount of the initial 22 allocation. The adjustment shall be calculated in December and 23 distributed to each eligible independent or dependent public school 24 district no later than January 15. A An independent or dependent \_ \_

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1 public school district shall receive an adjustment only if the 2 adjustment figure as calculated in this section is greater than 3 The State Department of Education shall retain from the total zero. 4 amount appropriated for textbooks not less than one percent (1%) of 5 the total amount to be used for the purpose of making the 6 adjustments. If the amount appropriated, including the retained 7 amount, is not sufficient to fully fund the adjusted allocation, 8 each independent or dependent public school district eligible for an 9 adjustment shall receive a proportionate reduction in funding. Any 10 unused portion of the value of textbooks allowed to a an independent 11 or dependent public school district shall be cumulative and may be 12 carried over by the independent or dependent public school district 13 to subsequent fiscal years, in addition to the allocation it is 14 entitled to receive during that fiscal year.

15 В. A school district seeking flexibility in the use of state-16 appropriated funding allocated pursuant to this section for 17 textbooks shall be required to demonstrate to the State Board of 18 Education that the textbooks and instructional materials used by the 19 district for the subject areas being considered in the current 20 textbook adoption cycle are current and appropriate for student 21 learning. Subject to the provisions of subsection E of Section 16-22 111 of this title, a school district that has received textbook 23 funding flexibility approval from the Board may elect to expend any 24 monies allocated pursuant to this section for textbooks, including

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<sup>1</sup> any monies carried over as authorized pursuant to subsection A of <sup>2</sup> this section, for any purpose related to the support and maintenance <sup>3</sup> of the school district as determined by the board of education of <sup>4</sup> the school district.

5 C. All textbooks distributed to  $\frac{1}{2}$  an independent or dependent 6 public school district that have been destroyed by fire or other 7 hazard shall be replaced by the State Board of Education. The total 8 cost of all additional textbooks delivered to independent or 9 dependent public school districts to replace those destroyed by fire 10 or other hazard shall not exceed, for the entire state in any fiscal 11 year, the aggregate sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars 12 (\$100,000.00), which sum shall be reserved for that purpose from any 13 appropriation made to carry out the provision of this section for 14 any fiscal year. 15 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019. 16 SECTION 5.
