21	1. An individual serving in the armed forces of the United
22	States, the United States Public Health Service, the United States
23	Department of Veterans Affairs, or any other federal agency while
24 27	engaged in activities regulated by this state as a part of

1 employment with that federal agency if the individual holds a valid 2 license to practice the regulated occupation or profession issued by 3 any other state or jurisdiction; and

4 2. The spouse of an individual serving in the armed forces of
5 the United States while the individual is stationed within this
6 state, if:

a. the spouse holds a valid license to practice the
 regulated occupation or profession issued by any other
 state or jurisdiction, and

b. the license is current and the spouse is in good standing in the state or jurisdiction of licensure. SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4100.9 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The following individuals are exempt from paying a license fee: An individual serving in the armed forces of the United States while the individual is stationed within this state, if:

- a. the individual holds a valid license to practice the
 regulated occupation or profession issued by any other
 state or jurisdiction, and
 - b. the license is current and the individual is in good standing in the state or jurisdiction of licensure; and
