18 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Delete the title, enacting clause and entire bill
19 and replace with:

20 "An Act relating to crimes and punishments; creating
21 the Sergeant Craig Johnson Act; amending 21 O.S.
22 2011, Section 173, which relates to the definition
23 of accessories; modifying scope of definition;
24 providing for noncodification; and declaring an
emergency.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
3 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

4 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Sergeant Craig
5 Johnson Act".

6 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 173, is
7 amended to read as follows:

8 Section 173. All persons who, after the commission of any
9 felony, conceal or aid the offender, with knowledge that he or she
10 has committed a felony, and with intent that ~~he~~ the person may avoid
11 or escape from arrest, trial, conviction, or punishment, are
12 accessories. In the case of murder, a person is accountable under
13 this statute for accessory to murder if the person knew or
14 reasonably should have known that the conduct committed upon the
15 victim could foreseeably result in the death of the victim.

16 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
17 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
18 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
19 be in full force from and after its passage and approval."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1176 of Title 21, unless there
15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. It shall be unlawful for a person, who by telephonic or
17 electronic communication, as defined in Section 1172 of Title 21 of
18 the Oklahoma Statutes, to willfully publish on a public online site
19 or forum, attempt to publish or conspire to publish personally
20 identifiable information of a law enforcement officer with the
21 intent to threaten, intimidate, harass or stalk, or as a result,
22 causes, attempts to cause or would be reasonably expected to cause
23 substantial emotional distress or financial loss to that person, or
24 to that officer's family or household member or intimate partner.

1 B. Except as provided in subsection C of this section, any
2 person convicted of the provisions of subsection A of this section
3 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

4 C. Any person who is convicted of a second or subsequent
5 offense pursuant to this section shall be guilty of a felony.

6 D. As used in subsection A of this section:

7 1. "Personally identifiable information" shall include, but not
8 be limited to:

9 a. name,

10 b. birth date,

11 c. address,

12 d. telephone number,

13 e. driver license number,

14 f. Social Security number,

15 g. place of employment,

16 h. mother's maiden name, or

17 i. a photograph or any other realistic likeness;

18 2. "Family or household member" shall mean parents including
19 grandparents, stepparents, adoptive parents and foster parents;
20 children including grandchildren, stepchildren, adopted children and
21 foster children; and persons otherwise related by blood or marriage
22 living in the same household; and

23 3. "Law enforcement officer" shall mean any officer, agent or
24 employee of a state, unit of local government, or an Indian tribe

1 authorized by law or by a government agency to engage in or
2 supervise the prevention, detection or investigation of any
3 violation of criminal law.

4 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
