10 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

11 An Act relating to the Department of Mental Health
12 and Substance Abuse Services; requiring that portions
13 of certain appropriated funds be used for certain
14 purposes; creating pilot programs; authorizing
15 request for early transfers of certain funds for
16 specific purpose; providing for lapse of funds under
17 certain conditions; requiring certain budget
18 procedures; and prohibiting certain budget
19 procedures.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. From the funds appropriated to the Department of
22 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill
23 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the
24 sum of One Million Five Hundred Forty-one Thousand Two Hundred
Fifty-two Dollars (\$1,541,252.00) shall be used for program growth.

1 SECTION 2. From the funds appropriated to the Department of
2 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill
3 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the
4 sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be used to
5 carry out the provisions of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 848 of the 1st
6 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature.

7 SECTION 3. From the funds appropriated to the Department of
8 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill
9 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the
10 sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be used to carry
11 out the provisions of Enrolled House Bill No. 2877 of the 1st
12 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature.

13 SECTION 4. From the funds appropriated to the Department of
14 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill
15 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the
16 agency shall increase the amount of crisis intervention training
17 sessions offered to members of law enforcement.

18 SECTION 5. From the funds appropriated to the Department of
19 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill
20 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the
21 sum of Two Million Thirty-four Thousand Dollars (\$2,034,000.00)
22 shall be used to expand connectivity programs between law
23 enforcement officers, mental health providers and Oklahomans in a
24 mental health crisis.

1 SECTION 6. From the funds appropriated to the Department of
2 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill
3 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the
4 sum of Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000.00)
5 shall be used to expand the number of mental health crisis centers
6 and urgent care centers.

7 SECTION 7. From the funds appropriated to the Department of
8 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill
9 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the
10 sum of Two Million Nine Hundred Sixty-six Thousand Dollars
11 (\$2,966,000.00) shall be used for additional mobile crisis teams to
12 respond and diffuse crisis situations in communities.

13 SECTION 8. From the funds appropriated to the Department of
14 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled House Bill
15 No. 2900 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the
16 sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be used to
17 maintain five pilot programs to provide offenders incarcerated in
18 county jails in the State of Oklahoma access to United States Food
19 and Drug Administration-approved, evidence-based, medication-
20 assisted treatment for opioid and alcohol dependence. Treatment may
21 be administered while the inmate is confined in the county jail and
22 when participating in outpatient care upon release. Funding may
23 only be used for medical evaluations, the purchase of United States
24 Food and Drug Administration-approved medication to treat opioid or

1 alcohol dependency, individual and group counseling services,
2 cognitive behavioral therapies and necessary medical and behavioral
3 health staff needed to implement the program.

4 SECTION 9. The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health
5 and Substance Abuse Services may request through the Director of the
6 Office of Management and Enterprise Services the early transfer by
7 the Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the General
8 Revenue Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the Department's
9 disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

10 SECTION 10. Appropriations made by Enrolled House Bill No. 2900
11 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, not including
12 appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for
13 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 (hereafter FY-22) or may be
14 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023 (hereafter FY-23).
15 Funds budgeted for FY-22 may be encumbered only through June 30,
16 2022, and must be expended by November 15, 2022. Any funds
17 remaining after November 15, 2022, and not budgeted for FY-23, shall
18 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal
19 year. Funds budgeted for FY-23 may be encumbered only through June
20 30, 2023. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2023, shall lapse
21 to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.
22 These appropriations shall not be budgeted in both fiscal years
23 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-22, and not required to pay
24 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-23, after

1 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared
2 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds
3 from the FY-22 budget work program and after such revision has been
4 approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

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
